## 93% FAVOR WATER BONDS

When the ballots were counted last Tuesday, Alpine, Dehesa, Flinn Springs, Harbison Canyon and Mountain Top had given a thunderous approval of the three million dollar bond issue necessary to bring water to this area.

No doubt the continued dry weather helped secure the bonds passage but the

size of the turnout and the high percentage of favorable votes must be credited to the Citizens Water Bond Committee and especially to Cecil Lewinson, the committee chairman.
