

STRANGE BIRDS DINE IN ALPINE GARDEN

Every year when pyrocanthus berries ripen, the strange cedar waxwings come in flocks of hundreds to feast. They fly here from the higher mountains, perch in the tall trees, descend by hundreds to gorge on the bright red fruit. As they light, the branches slowly descend till they nearly break.

The jolly little waxwing is the most polite bird in the world, known also as the cherry bird, they will feed one another each passing on the fruit, seeming too polite to partake. They are friendly, have a silky coat, with crest, and get their name from the tiny red waxy tip on wingtips. They do not sing, but make soft, bell-like notes. They post watchmen who sound alarms when people or cats appear.

It is a most interesting study, comical to see some extra hungry fellow gulp a whole berry get it stuck in his throat and have to make comical neck antics to get it down.

"We always phone our friends" says Hazel, "who slip into the house to watch the sight closeup through the windows".
