



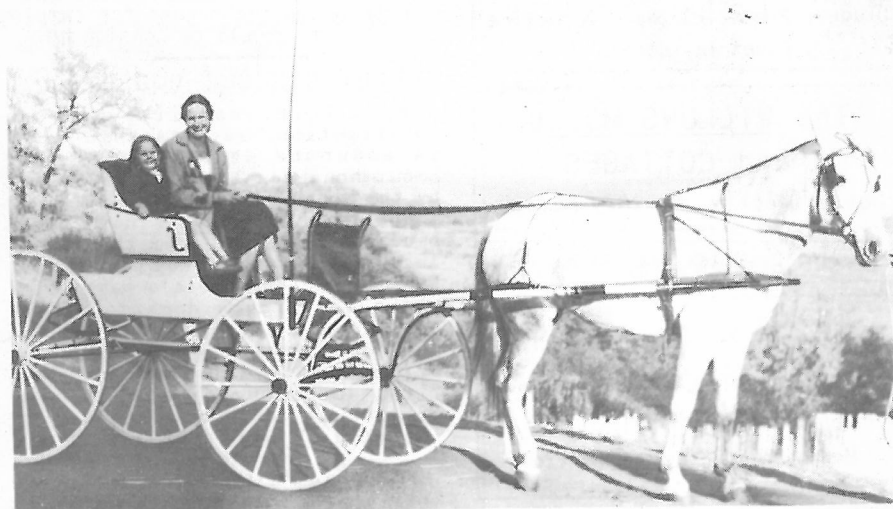
**FIRST STEP TAKEN

ADVERSE RULES HAMPER HORSEMEN

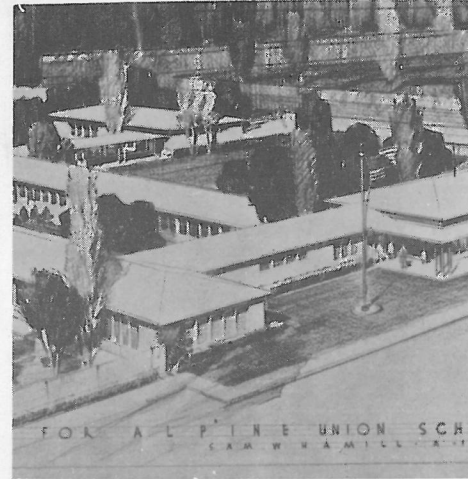
### CRASH KILLS ALPINE LAD
