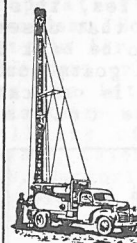

## ALPINE P.O. MOVES TO NEW HOME ON JULY 27

Contractor Forrest Hohanshelt is speeding completion of the fine new 24 x 50 foot postoffice building for Barney and Agnes Ratliffe, owners, who operate the famous Log Cabin here. Postmaster Phil Hall reveals that he will move across the street from the Alpine store building on Sunday, the 27th.

"Due to the difficulty of obtaining new equipment, we will have to use present set up" states Hall, "but I have been advised that our new fixtures are coming, including the new 108 boxes, which added to the present 188, will give Alpine 296, so there will be no more shortage".

He and his staff: Dorothy Hall, (his relief), Richard Place, regular clerk, Sam Randazzo, substitute, and Roy Clark, route carrier, are mighty proud of the new building, necessitated by this community's steady growth. The structure is modern with heating and lighting of latest design, and with the high ceilings, should prove comfortable.

The big route here, now 330 boxes, many of which serve several families and extra residents, has grown steadily, nearly 100 since Jan. 1, 1950 when it had 235. Jan. 1951 had 275, and this Jan. there were 315. General delivery averages around 50, but some of these are on the waiting list for boxes.

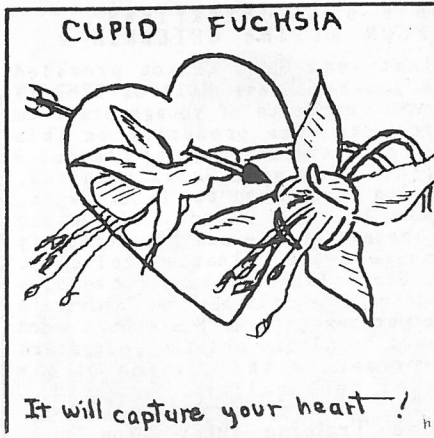

**GUINEA PIG GARDENER**

By Hazel Hohanshelt

Have you thought of fuchsias for that shady or semi-shady spot or north window box? Most people seem to think that this profusely blooming shrub needs the confines of a lath house or the moist air near the coast, but there is one variety especially, which certainly thrives in Alpine. I recommend Cupid, which grows only about 18 inches tall and makes a compact little bush about the same in diameter. This beautiful little shrub is excellent for window boxes, blooming continuously all year long until cut back severely the first of February. In just two months the fast-growing, thick and



luxuriant new growth is blooming again.

They are hardy to 22 degrees. Ours have never frozen in the three years we have had them. I planted King Alfred jonquils and yellow cottage tulips in two rows between the cupids, and every year there is a column of yellow marching past our window just in time to herald the host of fresh and lovely cupid flowers. When the bulbs are finished I gently press their long green foliage down flat upon the soil and weight them with a rock or two, or a few short pieces of board until I find they will lie flat without the weight. When they become yellow I cut them off, which is hardly necessary since they are almost completely hidden by the dense foliage of the fuchsias.

You will never forget the loveliness of our window of cupids, for they will win your heart as they have won ours. How well they were named.
