If this community is to profit by the mistakes and omissions of other towns that failed to plan for future growth, citizens and chamber of commerce will get busy and lay plans for such inevitable county growth.

Zoning and planning are needed, to protect residential properties, and safequard business investments, with a definite civic center plan.

The sanitary district is practically assured which will mean building and progress with increase in every property value. But what Alpine needs is water, a lot of it, and an irrigation district so that this climate and fertile soil may produce commercially successful crops of citrus, avocados, sapotes and perhaps many other sub-tropical fruits and small crops that will find ready market in the metropolis of San Diego. This area could in time outstrip such heavy producing places as Vista, Fallbrook, Escondido and others.

This is something for you property owners and business men to think about. It means prosperity and security for Alpine.




