Directors of Alpine Youth Center have just loaned a lookout site for the Ground Observers' station.

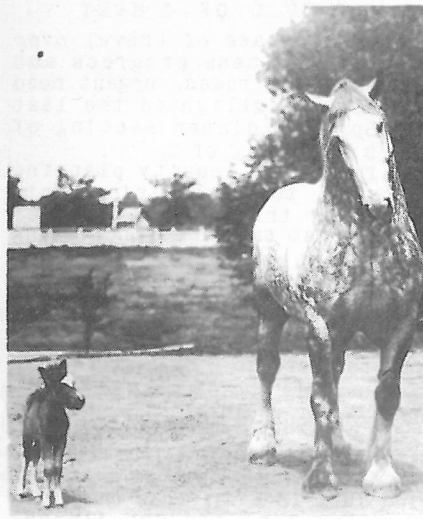

ZONING, TRAFFIC LIVE HIWAY 80 C OF C MEET

Steady increase of travel over Hiway 80, business progress and more and better roads, urgent need for zoning, highlighted the last Flinn Springs dinner meeting of Alpine's Hiway 80 C of C.

Willis Miller, county planning commission, told surprising facts about heavy travel over 80, over which tourist travel is increasing more than on any other hiway entering California! Last year it got 12% of all cars entering.

This county has grown from 300,000 to over 700,000. Traffic was expected to increase 2% but jumped 7%. S. D. county is spending \$7 million a year on major roads. US 80, now with US 90 added, and Arizona cutoffs, will increase tourist travel here.

A recent check showed in a 16 hour period July 13 & 14, that on Sunday 6,409 cars went through Alpine, 3595 on Monday. For the first four months of 1952, 73,636 tourist cars checked west at Yuma, an increase of 28% over the 1951 period. Last year's total coming in on 80--through here--was 170,047, a jump of 34% over 1950.

The chamber approved of zoning here on areas for residential, manufacturing, junkyards and so on, to protect property values. (Sun editorial Aug. 14).

MARSHAL GIVES FIRE WARNINGS

Because of the menace of very dry weather and recent brush fires started by faulty incinerators, Fire Marshal Conard has made some routine inspections and advised residents on just how to prevent such needless blazes.

"There are six points" he states "that will greatly help us and might prevent a needless fire that could consume or damage your own home".

1. Keep cans and bottles out of burner.
2. Put garbage in proper receptacle
3. Clean out ashes regularly.
4. See that the drum or burner is well ventilated at bottom so combustion will be complete, not smoulder.
5. Keep Grass cleared well away.
6. Above all, have a proper spark arrester, fine hardware cloth or screen.

Of course you should burn before 9 a.m. and only after 6 p.m., have permit for open fires.
