election. If this goes over, the school can connect. Any qualified voter living in this sanitation area, may ballot, whether he owns property or not. Everyone in that area is urged to vote.  
 "There will be no question of illegal disposal of sewage or the shutting down of our school either now or in the future" declares School Board president, G.L. Klipp "and the opening of the new school will not be unduly delayed".

**START ROAD STUDY**  
 A state highway survey of roads from El Cajon to Japatul via Dehesa and Harbison Canyon, is underway by a 3-man crew to obtain an origin-destination chart, as part of a continuing checkup on travel frequency in this part of the back country. This will no doubt aid the Alpine school, other bodies and residents in their request for improvement of the Alpine-Japatul county road.

BRIDGE TASK IS COMPLETED  
Saturday E.F. McKnight, Super-  
intendent, pulled his trailer out  
of the camp at Sweetwater river  
bridge, leaving only three workers  
to finish the big job of moving  
this structure. (See pictures  
next page.) Contractors Johnson &  
Johnson, Fullerton, have been on  
it for several months and now  
highway crews are finishing the  
new road to go over the bridge.

The men who went ahead of Mc-  
Knight are Harvey Thomas and his  
father, J.W.; Alex L. Subia, Fay  
Grove and A.T. McCutchen. All  
had trailers. The three leaving  
soon, with trailers, are Jess  
Elizond, in charge, Joe Levia  
and Thos. Hyde.

The crew has gone to Needles  
where they have a 5 months  
contract to repair 34 highway  
bridges. Quite a few in Alpine,  
where the men traded, learned to  
know and like these fellows, a  
nice lot, indeed.

The bridge was moved 1000' up-  
stream as the Loveland dam will  
back up the river above it which  
would have covered the bridge  
with 6' of water. It is 280' long.  
The giant cranes, here for a  
week, cost \$40,000. each, were  
manned by driver and operator,  
rented at \$85. per hour! Two  
were from Pioneer Truck Co., S.D.  
and a pair from Pacific Crane  
and Rigging Co., L.A.

H.E. Coburn, bridge engineer,  
under J.H. Mack, county surveyor,  
was present. Robert Hebert, also  
a county man, was resident  
engineer on the job with Don  
Klitsch, engineer No. 1. This  
was one of the largest moving  
projects of its kind ever under-  
taken, has attracted wide in-  
terest.

Officers (for 53) Chas. Kern, Dr.  
Frank Bornowski, Ken Douglass and  
L. Titus, attended the 11th division  
conference of Kiwanis at San Diego  
last Monday.


