The board includes, in addition to the above, Dr. Frank J. Bornowski, Al D. Hinkle, S.S. Pandazzo, Fred D. Rushing, Carl J. Schweiss, John N. Vitalich, Judge A. Walters; John K. Wilson and Mrs. Jessie A. Young.

Various plans and projects for the welfare of Alpine have been outlined by the board, foremost being a thorough investigation of the possibilities of establishing a water district to provide the community with adequate water.

The Schoonovers love Alpine, and are now living here, building their home in Glen Oaks, having recently returned from a trip and family reunion in Kansas.

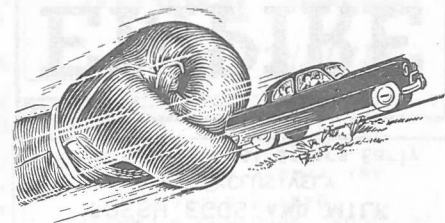

VOTE SURVEY FOR TUNNEL

A \$50,000 survey has been voted by the S.D. County board of supervisors to determine the feasibility of building the big tunnel under the Lagunas to provide a low-level railway, highway, water and express route between S.D. and Imperial counties and the East. It is believed that this great project, costing many millions, will be a reality within 20 years or sooner. 'We like Alpine fine, and believe it has a promising future' they both say, 'and we hope to grow with the community and will endeavor to serve the mountain area to the fullest.'

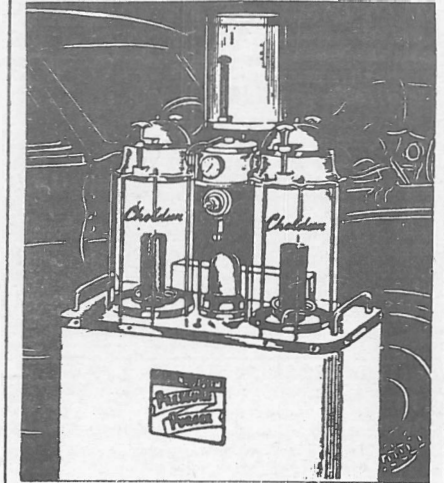
