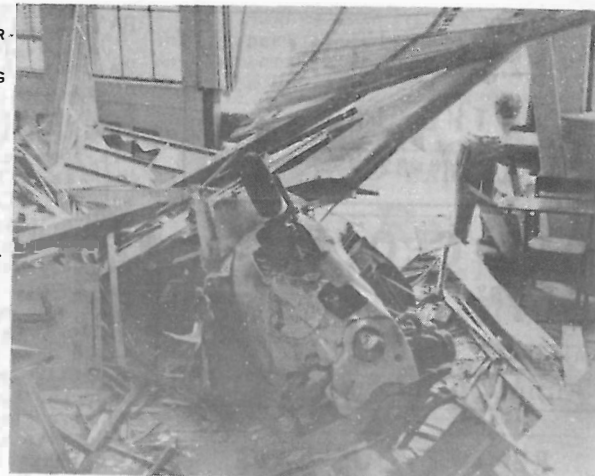
the lively group headed by James and Marie Cundari, who conceived the plan, along with Chas. Manuele, another rancher. Maps are in hand now.

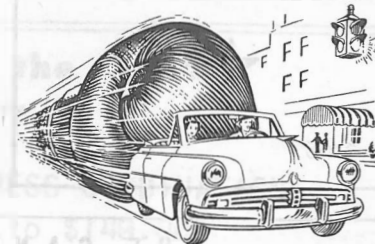

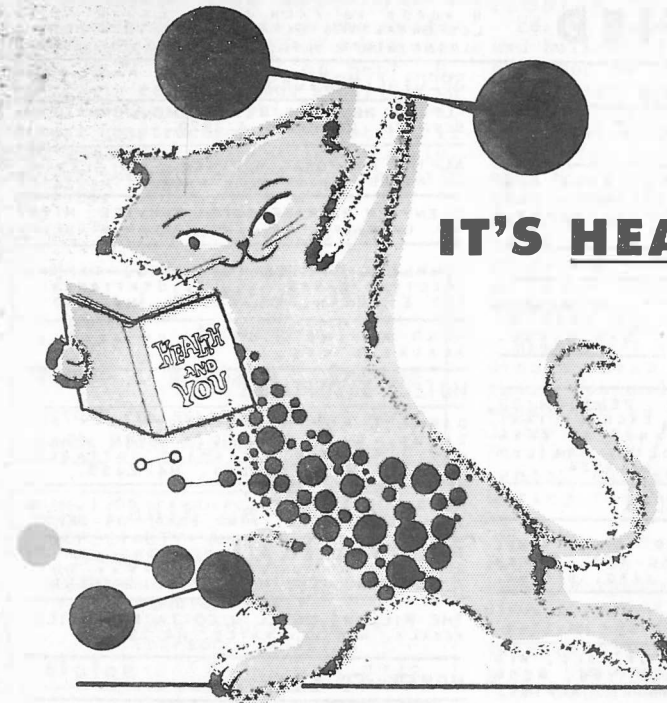

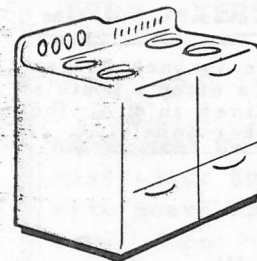
