EDITORIAL

HOW UNJUST IS UNCLE SAM? Freedom was the keynote for the foundation of the U.S. And freedom has been the cry ever since. But did you know that the federal government is gradually relieving us of freedom, while yelling about the American way of life and warning us to fear outside subversive influences.

For example, your phone bill is made up of two separate accounts. One is the cost of service. The other is a wartime excise tax on service, which the company turns over to Uncle Sam. Last year this unjust and annoying tax cost each customer \$22. over \$1.80 a month, nearly a sixth of your phone cost. You have to pay 15% on local service, and long distance under 25%, on calls over 25%.

Only two items are taxed higher than long distance calls, liquor and cigarettes, with jewelry, cabarets, furs next. Then local phone service, long distance passenger travel, pleasure cars, fishing equipment, TV and musical instruments.

Yet there is no tax on electricity, local transportation, water or gas. All these are utilities, essentials of life. But we, in a great country of creature comforts and necessary things, must pay a burdensome tax on the phone: which must stand a tax higher than luxuries, sports, vices, and I think we may safely refer to booze and cigarettes as vices.

In addition, the petty figuring of this complex tax adds to the overhead of the phone company the same as sales tax and other levies that annoy the hard pressed businessman Life is complicated enough without adding to the burden. Off with it.





The building was started with a bequest of \$5,000 from Mrs. DeForrest Smith, a former Alpine resident. Many gifts and memorials followed.

The altar and reredos, the work of Mrs. Margaret Montgomery, a member of the faculty of Scripps College at Pomona, is a gift of Mrs. Arthur Pratt, remembering her mother, Catherine Ellen Humphries. It is a mural made of vitreous enamel on copper tiles, the largest of this art type ever done. The panels are of the various Christian symbols interwoven with a grapevine. A 12' cross of golden tile rises above the altar, at the very top is a dover. Included in Mrs. Pratt's memorial

The attractive structure is of red brick and native stone with natural shingle roof, a blend of traditional and modern thought. The stone was donated by Hans Kern, the stonework done by Guy Phelps. Pews are of light oak; interior bleached wood and brick, in keeping with the rustic decor Alpine has assumed.

The electric organ, bought three years ago, resulted from the singlehanded efforts of Gail Wilson who raised the money. The old bell from the town hall of 1899, is in the modern belfry, having served many years in the old church, now Fuller memorial hall.

Architects were Johnson, Hatch and Wulff of S.D. and construction by Roger Beatty, El Cajon, Sam Maloof designer and woodworker, executed the art items.

Alpine is indeed mighty proud of its lovely new church.
