TWO ESCAPE DEATH IN CRASH

Garage and highway patrol men are still wondering just how a 16-year old couple escaped death when Mrs. Hosmer McKoon's car in which they were riding Saturday night plunged 90 feet end over end down a precipice 5½ miles east of Alpine. The car was almost totally demolished. It bounced on huge boulders on its way down the cliff.

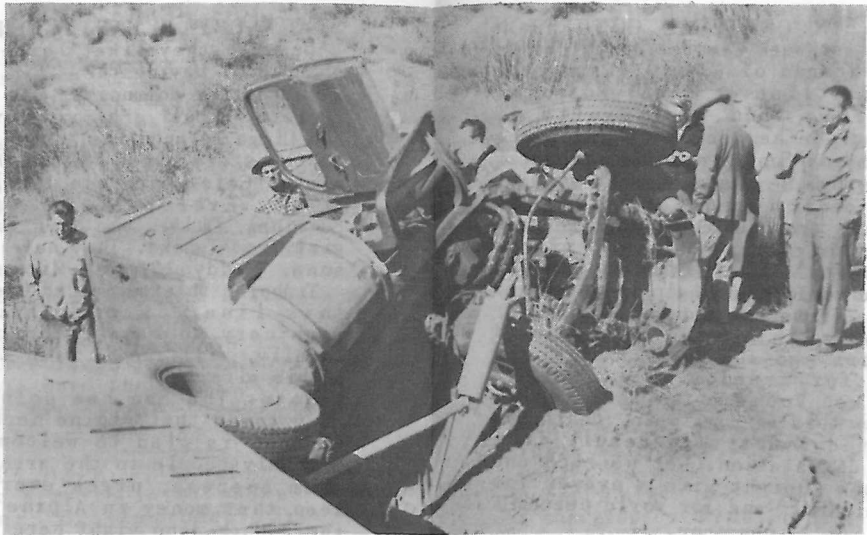

HEATS DEATH IN TRUCK CRASH
 Claude M. Hodges, 29, Dallas, Tex., is still wondering how he lived through the wreck of his truck and van trailer here last week when his brakes failing, he collided with a tanker truck and trailer in front of Alpine Motor Service as he raced downhill at 70 miles an hour. Luckily the tankers were empty, and driver Albert Torres, S.D., suffered only a bump on his head. He fortunately was able to bring the forward vehicle to a stop right side up, but the trailer was flipped over, its rear dual wheels crossing the highway barely missing Mrs. Jim Rorie, driving eastward with Mrs. Nelson Anderdon.

Hodges was taken to La Mesa Hospital after first aid by Walter Finch, of Alpine Motor Service, a veteran and Red Cross man. His brother Bud, saw the wreck from the garage office window, raced to aid Hodges out of the cab, collapsed in accordion fashion. The engine was thrown clear of the frame by the terrific impact.

80 CHAMBER HEARS ENGINEER

The meeting of Highway 80 Chamber of Commerce was a lively, well attended one at Ye Alpine Tavern last week, with 30 present to enjoy the delicious dinner.

President Don Walker opened the meeting, turned it over to Marcus Schaeffer who presented the speaker, R.B. Luckenbach, assistant state highway engineer.

He gave an enlightening talk on freeways and improvement of 80 above here, definitely stated that the highway will not by-pass Alpine, nor will it be moved hereabouts, promised better access to S.D. with extension of the freeway through El Cajon and to Tunnel Hill, within 3 to 5 years. He said widening in Alpine is not justified by present traffic as shown by recent counts. No early plans exist for completion of the grade elimination above here, he said.

The chamber is formulating a petition to be sent to the state by various Alpine organizations requesting early completion of the remaining bad section, stopped a couple of years ago.

PHONE RAISE IS PROTESTED

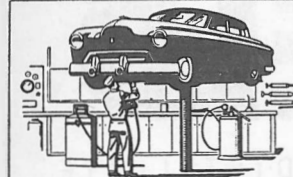
