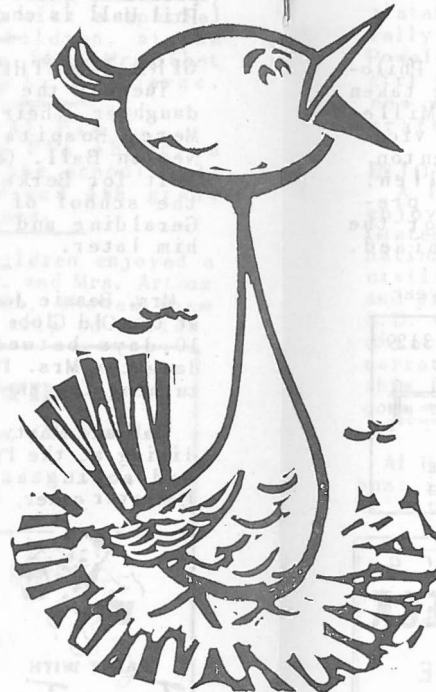

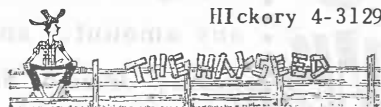
80 CHAMBER TO HEAR PORTER

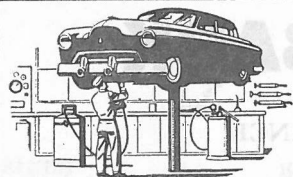
