McGUINNESS IN AUTO WRECK

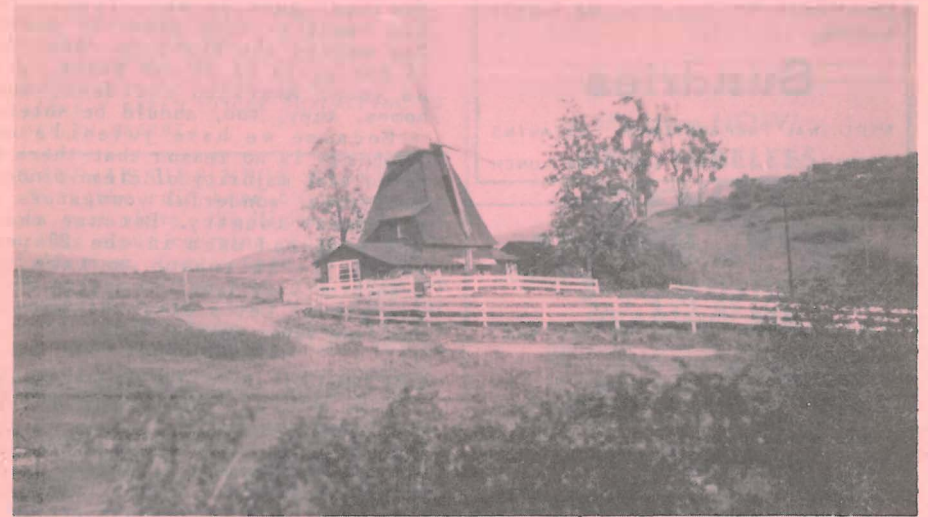

FINE TALK BY ARTHUR EDDY

The third open community meeting of Alpine Chamber of Commerce, although the audience was meager, was a highlight session with Assessor Arthur C. Eddy as speaker. He gave a highly interesting and pleasing talk on the work and problems of his office.

Ed Rike, chamber president, presided, turned the meeting over to Secretary John Reynolds who introduced the speaker. Mr. Eddy told many facts and figures of the county, which is growing so fast.

'If we are wrong we want to know it' he said, 'and we want you to come in and see us'. He urged keeping elective offices, not that he is opposed to civil service. He pointed out that S.D. is the fastest growing county of 3300 in America, and S.D. the speediest expanding city! This growth is reflected in veterans' exemptions of which there were 8000 in 1940, but 63000 now, the 1953 increase being 6500.

Note- It is regretted that the Sun does not have ample space for such real news, we could use a whole page to describe the talk of genial Mr. Eddy, veteran of W.W. 2 when he served as lieutenant in the navy. He is a law graduate of Whittier college and Duke University, coming to the office as executive assistant in 1949, taking over the duties of his father, Crowell Eddy when he resigned. So if he comes here again, don't miss meeting and hearing him. CI

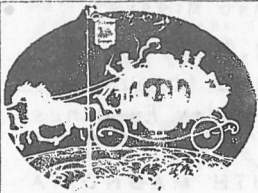

PILGRIMS DINE, THEN AUCTION

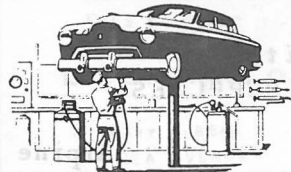

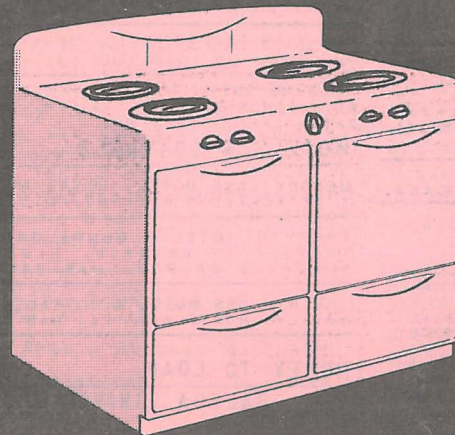
