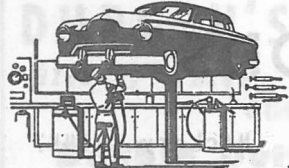

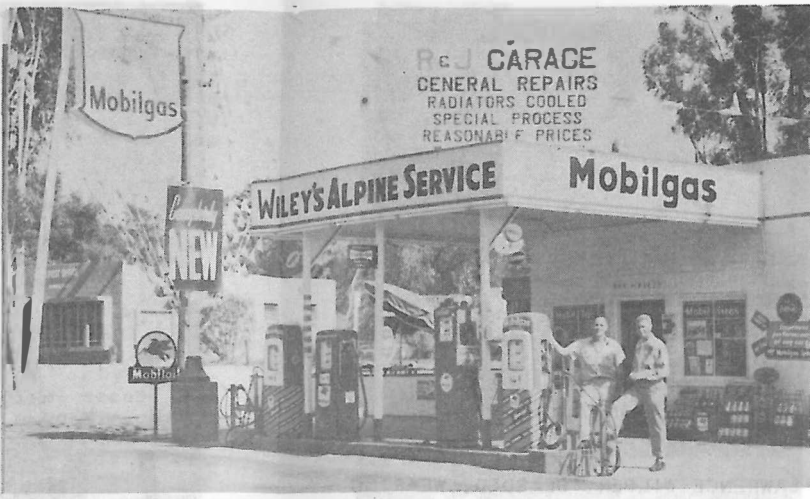

with his parents Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Wilber, from Greeley, Colo., where he was born in 1877. They lived on a ranch at Arnold way and Harbison Canyon Road when the stage went through to the old Tavern. In those days there were only two houses between Alpine and El Cajon, few automobiles. He remained a bachelor. When he was 10, the family went to Mexico where 18 years were spent in teaching farming, Lawrence learning the language like a native. After 18 years they returned to Alpine.

Survivors are, besides the Johnsons, cousins Mrs. L.G. Steward, and Mrs. Lewis Van Buskirk, and son Duane, of Colo. and Fred Van Buskirk, of California.

Services were held Tuesday at 2 in Erickson-Andeesson Mortuary, La Mesa, with interment in the family plot at Alpine Cemetery.

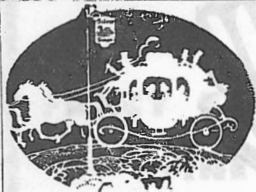
