NEW SEWER IN OPERATION

With 14 laterals all in for that number of connections, some of which are already hooked up by plumbers, Alpine's new sewer is actually in operation. EDITORIAL

LET'S GO AFTER HIGHWAY 80

Now that engineers have reported that the low-level tunnel is not feasible financially, although otherwise it could be accomplished, it is up to the Highway 80 Chamber of Commerce and other bodies from El Cajon to El Centro, to get busy and urge improvement of this great U.S. Artery.

Directors of the S.D. Highway development association adopted a resolution to this effect. according to Neil Brown, spokesman, that body will 'devote all of its efforts to the immediate improvement of Highway 80'

Alpine's chamber last week went on like record at the instigation of Marcus Schaeffer, chairman of a meeting of the 80 chamber to be held on Tuesday, Sept. 28, at 8 p.m. in Fuller Hall. Sen. Kraft has been invited to speak, also Jack Shrade and others who might help to get quick action, especially from El Cajon through Alpine. 'We want a 4 lane artery for this section' says Schaeffer, and the Viejas grade and curves fixed up as soon as possible'.

We back up this movement 100%, and hope that highway officials will start by bringing Alpine's business area into full four lane width, so that curbs and walks may be put in so the parking situation and traffic dangers eliminated. CI.

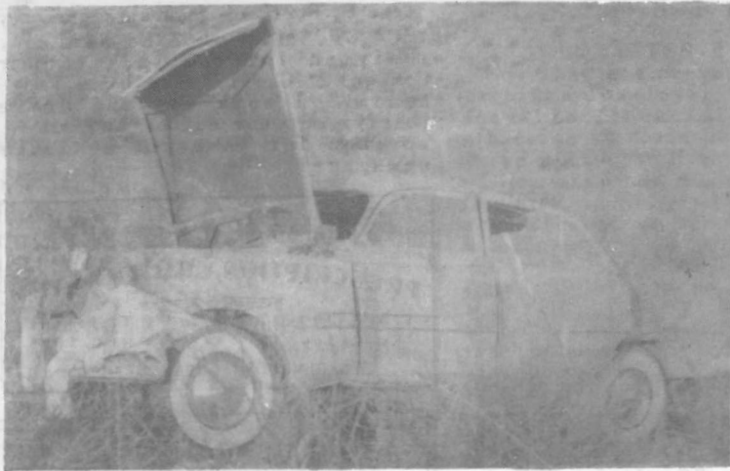

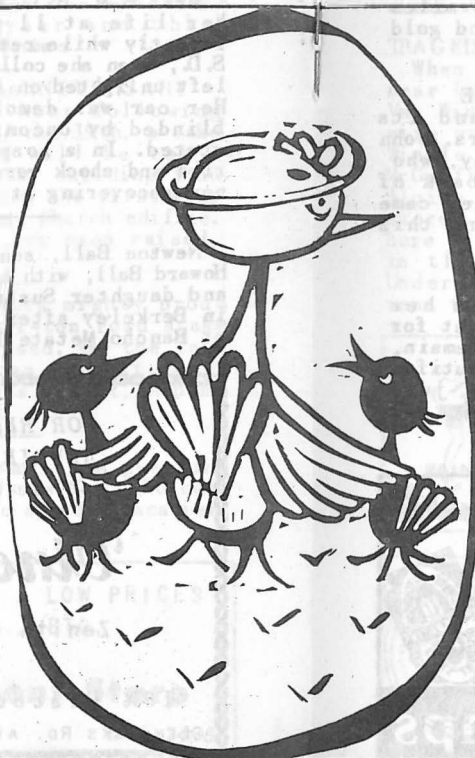

ALPINE MAN DIES IN TRAFFIC

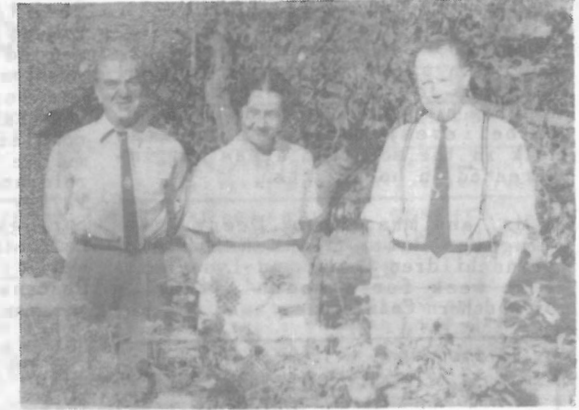
