

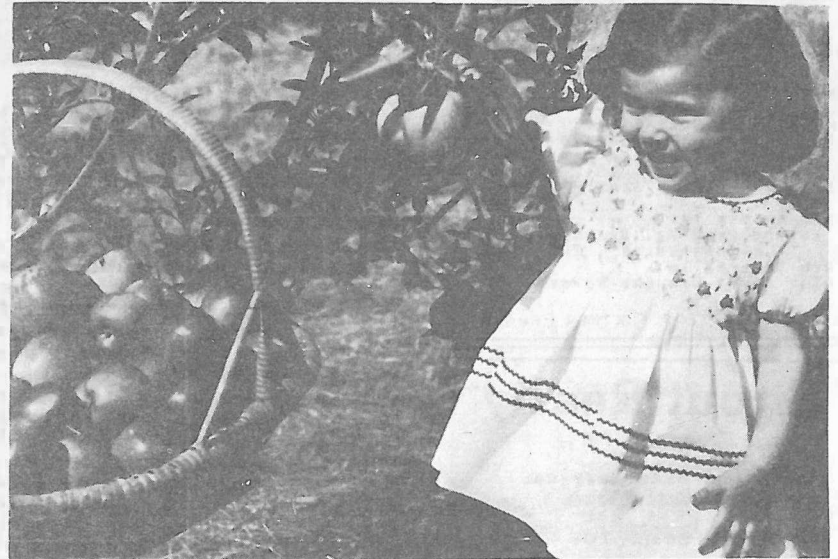
**KRAFT, SHRADE AT 80 MEET**

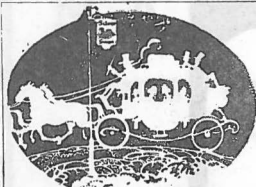
