KRAFT, SCHRADE AT 80 MEET A lively session was held at Fuller Hall Tuesday night by the Highway 80 Chamber of Commerce when Sen. Fred Kraft and Jack Schrade. Republican nominee for the 80th assembly district, told members that they would do all they could to speed improvement of U.S. 80. However, neither could promise much early progress, due mainly to the fact that highway business is in the hands of the state commission.

Don Walker, president, was in charge. Humphrey ; ane, chairman, introduced Jas. ! eavenside, history clerk in the senate. kraft gave an interesting talk on the terrific growth of the state in the past decade, agreed to the urgency of development of 80.

He also touched upon water: 'Four years ago Feather River water was laughed at- today it is not far off'.

Schrade, who spent 29 years in the state, right on 80, promised to work for its improvement, said he could 'make no rash promises, but I'll be in there working for you-I live on 801' He added that the state needs 80 because it wlll develop the valley and the harbor. He also mentioned the need for water here, pointing out that La Mesa-Spring Valley, with which he was connected, proves that outlying areas can get needed water.

A resolution was adopted commending the S.D. Union for its recent front page story and editorial on the need for improvement of 80. Pres. Walker said that from 7th place on the list, it was not near the top in priority for improving.

The tasty dinner was homecooked by Mmes. Weiwel and McCullough.

DOUBLE CLASSES IMPEND' G







It was first called the Alpine Booster Club, then Monte Viejas club. In 1932 it affiliated with the Alpine Hall Co., became known as the Alpine Woman's Club Auxiliary. As the club grew, desire for their own clubhouse grew, and the treasury was built up with this project in mind. Thus when the opportunity came to buy the Alpine Hall in 1933 they were ready. A board of directors from the club continued as the

Alpine Hall Co. until its dissolut on June 2nd, 1936, when the Alpine Womans' Club became incorporated and was able to handle the affairs of owning property and buildings.

Their achievements have been many through the years. The hall has been the scene of many benefits, dances, shows, political rallies and church meetings. Until the school auditorium was built it was the only large

gathering place in Alpine.

They have participated in many major drives, were active in the Red Cross through both wars. The county library is in the clubhouse. Their activities in welfare are numerous, and the club has been a member of the Needlework Guild since 1921. Yearly the club has had Christmas baskets for needy families, and their interest in the Indians' welfare in Alpine was materially shown since 1921.
