## FARM & RANCH NEWS

### BROILER PICTURE BRIGHTER

A survey of many broiler breeder flocks across New England, the Central Atlantic states, the South and the Midwest indicates the broiler situation will be most favorable in months.

The questions asked were:

1. The per cent increase or decrease in replacement pullets not yet in production and:
2. The per cent increase or decrease in chicks started for replacement flocks during the last three months as compared with the same period a year ago.

This survey was checked with local breeders, hatcheries and dealers.

The survey revealed an average reduction of about 10% in the breeder replacement pullets on hand but not yet in production. It also revealed an average reduction of about 20% in the number of replacement chicks started for broiler breeder flocks during the past three months.

All indications point toward profitable prices for growers for several months. For, with fewer breeder replacement pullets on hand but not yet in production, and a still greater reduction in the

number of chicks started for replacement flocks, one thing is certain:

There are going to be fewer eggs for hatcheries, fewer chicks for broiler growers and fewer birds going to market - at least for the next several months.
