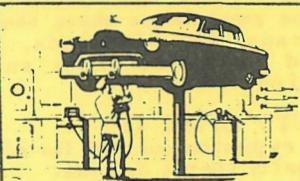

## Editorial



**80 SLATED FOR IMPROVEMENT**  
Billions will be spent so on on U.S. 80 and other major highway construction under Pres. Eisenhower's great interstate road network plan for industry and defense.

This, according to engineers, will make 80 one of the great east-west routes with full freeway soon as far as Arizona, eventually to the Atlantic. That will mean a lot for Alpine and the back country, clear to the Imperial garden area.

The S.D. chamber of Commerce, mayor, highway bodies and other organizations have urged immediate completion of the Viejas grade so that movement of cotton from the valley may flow to the proposed harbor developments which S.D. just voted a \$9½ million bond issue.

One proponent is John Davis, president, La Mesa & El Cajon Savings & Loan, who pointed out at the last meeting of the Highway 80 Chamber of Commerce, why this work should be expedited. Paul Luckenbach, assistant district engineer was speaker at the dinner, Antler's Lodge at which Pres. Don Walker was in charge.

Motorists, specially truckers, avoid 80 only because of the bad curves and high grades' Davis told the meeting, in answering the engineer's explanation that it was difficult to get funds for 80 due to the low traffic.

Main problem now, according to E.E. Wallace, S.D. district engineer, is deciding what to do after the present restudy of the Viejas section; whether to use tunnel or open cuts, also as to making it four lanes now or later.

Alpine motorists will be glad to know that money has already been allocated to convert Mission Valley to full freeway, bypassing El Cajon to Tunnel Hill.

Note- Main urgency now is to get four lanes from that point clear to Alpine. - CI.

**HINKLE BAGS BOARS**

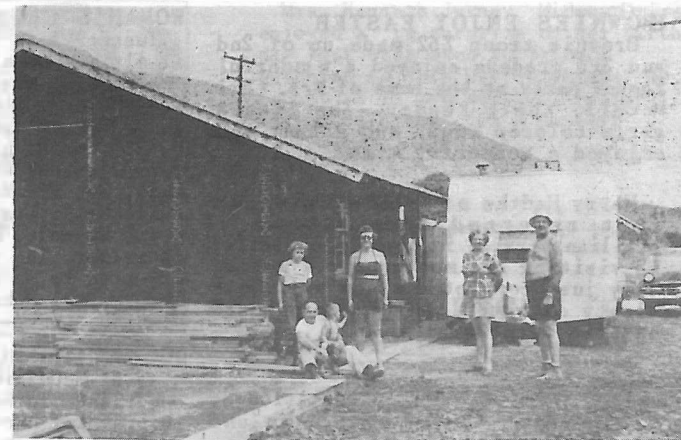
