Editorial



FIRE COULD HAVE BEEN HELD

Over 5000 acres of brush and trees were burned in the big fire last week-end. Much of this was in Alpine-Navy Hill, South Grade Road and Alpine Heights Road areas. Dozens of homes were menaced, and the Alpine village area might have gone before the flames fanned by a brisk seabreeze.

The sad part is that Alpine's part in the fire might have been stopped at a proposed firebreak that property owners failed to give the green light for last year. The idea was started by Henry McKie, jr., then commissioner, carried on by R. Oeser, present commissioner.

He sent out letters with stamped return envelopes for reply, to 37 deed holders of lands running from Highway 80 on the north, to Alpine Heights Road on the south. The idea was to get rights-of-way for a 300' swath 3.7 miles long, to be cut by the county and state at no personal cost to the owners, and to not destroy trees or infringe on property in use.

Only 20 replied most of them favorably; 17 failed to answer. One woman complained she would not give such permission as she did not want the looks of her property spoiled.

Well, today hundreds of acres are well spoiled, they are charred hills that will allow winter rains to wash off tons of topsoil.

What we need in these mountains is more firebreaks, in fact every road should be cleared for 15 to 20 feet on each side so that fire could not jump as it did on South Grade Road last Sunday. -CI





ALPINE HENS FARE WELL

A survey by the Sun after the heat wave last week reveals that Alpine's famed climate paid off well to poultrymen who lost but few chickens.

Ed Zimmer who has one of the largest plants in the county, all automatic, on his 24-acre place Adobe Hacienda above Alpine, lost only 45 birds, 8 being normal daily mortality for his 15,000 flock. This worked out to 1/3 of 1% mortality due to the heat.

Bud Archer lost some 45 birds, a low rate for his huge flock, and other henmen lost but few. Those who had birds on the ground suffered no losses.

Glenview Feed Co., lost over 3000 layers, and some of the valley poultrymen lost upwards of that number also.
