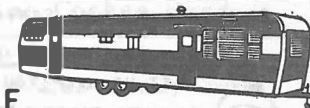

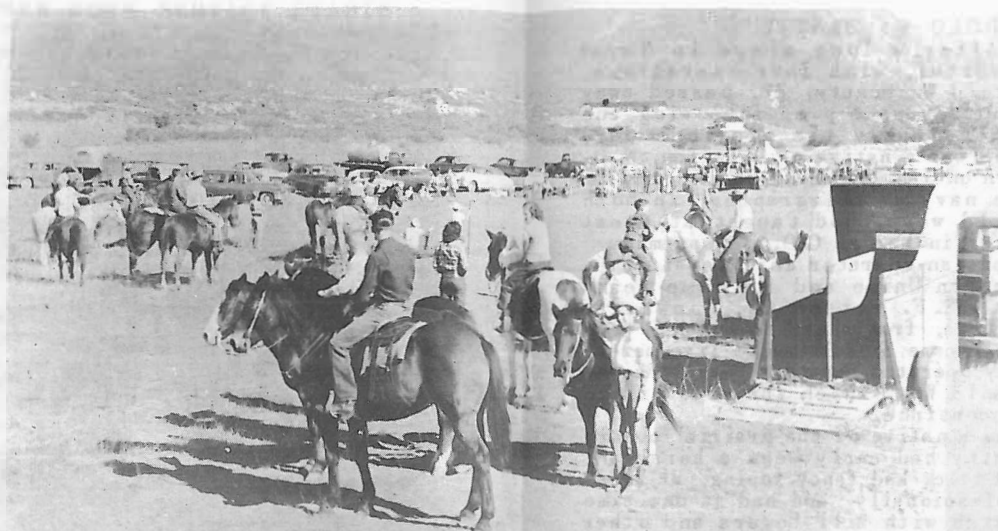

HAROLD W. BEATTY.

After a long siege in Naval Hospital, with four operations, Harold W. Beatty, 57, passed away Saturday at 4 p.m. following the last surgery the previous day.

He was a native of Wahapton, N.D. born on Jan. 4, 1898. He had been in the navy as telegrapher, in both World wars, had taught at Great Lakes in WW2 as CPO. 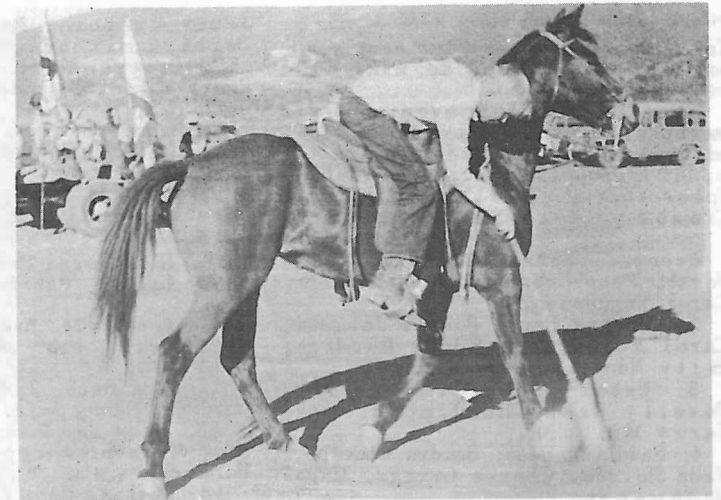
A few Alpine teens attended the Harvest Ball recently: Steve Mercer, F.F.A. treasurer, escorted one of the queen candidates during the crowning.

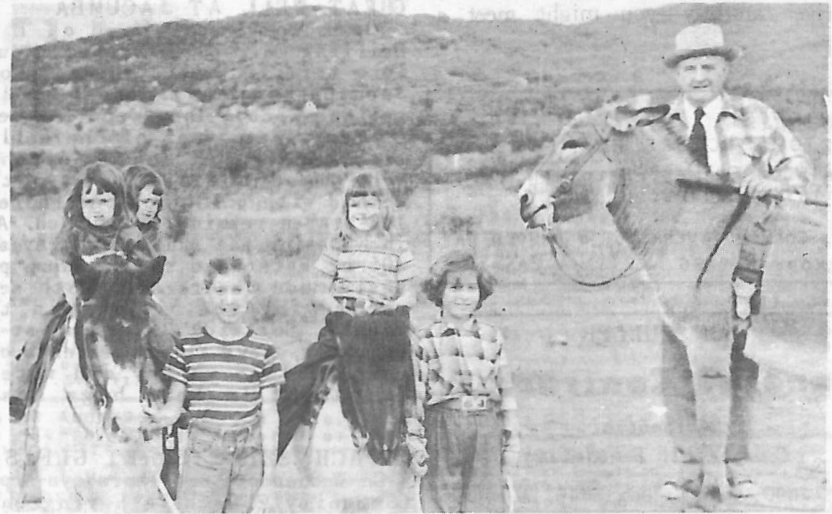
