

Due to the continual haphazard parking condition in A lpine's business district, the Highway patrol plans to give citations, the Alpine Council has been informed. The law calls for parallel parking, whereas here everyone parks straight in and at angles. Many times motorists get blocked in when two or three cars park around them.
