Today we could get Colorado River water, but that will cost money. But many are spending thousands each year drilling wells and deepening old ones. Year by year this cost goes merrily on but hooking up to a big supply would stop that. Feather River water is 20 years off but what Alpine needs is water today, now. C.1.


