



WORST FOREST FIRE ALL DONE

All that remains of the fatal Inaja Reservation fire which burned some 50,000 acres in a 90-mile perimeter, killed 11 men, destroyed several homes and ruined a vast watershed, is merely the probe by Forest Service officials. It was the worst fire in 25 years, started by a 15-year old Indian boy 'to see

Funeral services were held for one local fighter, 19-year old 1955 Grossmont graduate, of Harbison Canyon, Carlton Pay Lingo, with the forestry at Descanso. See pictures by Al Howe on other pages.






