Survivors besides his widow Bernice O., are a son Jack, of S.D., a daughter, Mrs. Shirley Woods, of Alpine, and three grandchildren.





total of 707 boxes in and out of the office, or population-wise, at 3% persons per box, 2127 people.

The county figures Alpine's population at 1947, the highway department at 1700, while the Sun estimates 2500.

Postmaster Hall adds that 'people generally mailed earlier this Christmas which made the handling of holiday mails easier. With two windows open and our very capable aixiliary help we were able to take good care of our patrons without the waiting in line experienced in most larger offices'.
