Dr. Miller was accompanied by Roger Courtney, chief, advance plan division, who exhibited maps of other towns that had been zoned. He detailed the entire procedure, mentioning that in Oct. 1952 the idea had been broached but no action taken

The old McFadin Ranch, 2320 Hiway 80, above Florence's Market, which was sold last March to a local syndicate, later on June 14, to a group headed by Byrl D. Phelps, S.D. engineer, is to be the nucleus of an irrigation district, Phelps revealed to the Sun on Monday. The start will encompass only the business district below the ranch, the main idea, he says, is to furnish fire protection for the town with at least two hydrants.

Editorial... 

YOUR GUESS IS MINE TOO!

Recently we paid our county taxes, in the majority of bills the toll was higher than ever.

At the same time we got nicked another cent on sales tax for unincorporated areas. And before that the gas tax went up a cent, and recently gasoline, butane, oil and oil and oil products went up several times, so did electric rates.

Our tax burden may best be judged by figuring how much of our working time goes to pay for it. Back in 1929 only one day's labor in 10 went to support government, according to the N.A.M. Now the average is one in four-- 25%. What will this be 10 years from now? Or will the country survive? Your guess is as good as mine!

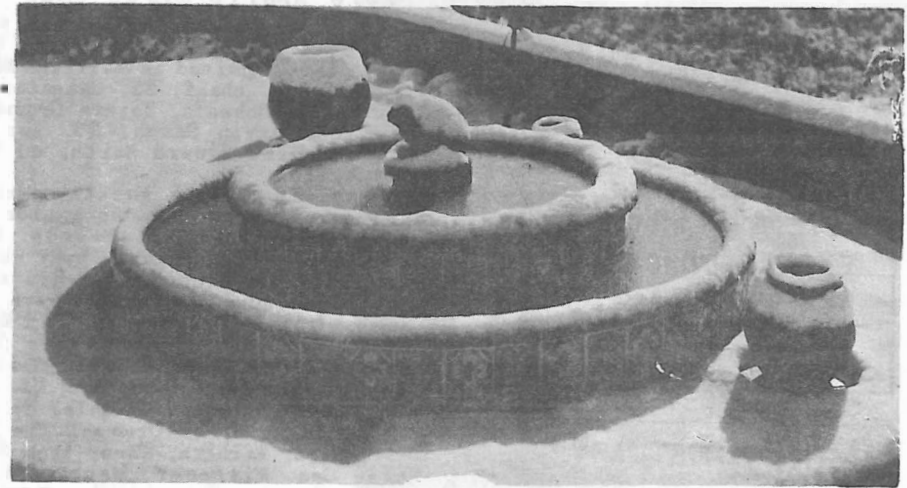
Less than two months away is income tax deadline. When this first began it took 6% as the highest toll of incomes over \$500,000. By 1941 the lowest rate had risen to the 6% level. But today bottom rate is 20% on the first \$2,000. from where it 'progresses' to a high of 91%, just 9% less than total confiscation!

But the federal income tax is only one of many-- too many-- taxes. In the myriads of taxes are state income, social security, insurance, property, sales and school, fire, tobacco and liquor, and so on. This means that on the average you and I have to work a third or more of our time to support government.

Isn't it time our statesmen woke up to this fact. Before some movement gets going that will awaken them, perhaps more rudely than they would enjoy? I fear for our country I fear for our country less from outside than from right here inside! - C.I.

In 1952 after Ike was elected we ran this from one of his talks: "Reckless spending and taxation can be as dangerous to our way of life as external threats". Remember, Mr. President? -C.I.

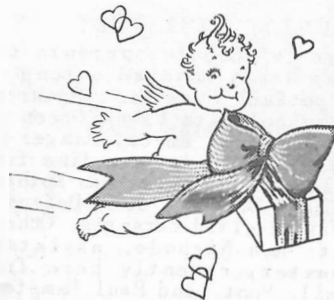

by Alpine, as "the groups were not working together".

Bud Archer, head of the businessmen's group said "We now have the Community Council and all member groups are agreed on planning, hence this meeting."

Dr. Miller pointed out the urgency of communities getting together as many areas have wailed "if we had only started 5 years ago we would not be in this mess" and similar complaints.

"People are coming to this part of the state and they're coming to Alpine, too", he said, pointing out that zoning would not be retroactive, but no new business or industry, etc., could be started once zoning is passed, and that should changes be found necessary, they could be made.

Among advantages Dr. Miller mentioned maintaining property values, helping guide community development and growth, uses of land, buildings, roads, services and so on, operating under the state planning law which sets up business, industrial, residential and agriculture areas with certain restrictions to benefit all.

Even though Alpine requests the project now, there are other communities on the list, so that it might be two years before work can start on the big task which requires many small sessions with local planners.

protection' stated Phelps, 'because should a good fire get going, it could wipe out the business area'.

As for furnishing water to business and resident users, he points out, 'We do not yet know just how much we have'. With some good wells hooked into the line to a proposed reservoir above the ranch, they might be able to supply more water until Colorado or Feather River is available.

He believes that this can be the nucleus for an eventual district to supply all of Alpine.

The ranch has 165 acres with 400' on Hiway 80, was sold for a reported \$120,000. Engineering is progressing on the proposed sub-division. Presently the Alpine Stables, run by Wm. Hollenbeck, has a two-year lease on the place for his riding academy. (See Sun 4-5-56 & 7-20-56).

That water is coming closer all the time was revealed by three residents of Blossom Valley who applied to the Helix District for annexation so that, when Colorado or other water is available, this area may get it. They were Lawrence Boerner, Elis M. Crane and Floyd E. Bird. Area covered was 5236 acres along Hiway 80, including Flinn Springs, Blossom Valley and Fairview Ranch, which is now building up fast. They plan an engineering study as to feasibility, costs and so forth.

Note- We believe that Alpine should do likewise for the sooner the better and cheaper will be the cost of installation to receive eventual supplies. In the meantime wells are having to be deepened and the water table is slowly, steadily descending. With ample water would come a bank, then more business and building of homes and possibly some agriculture on the outskirts which would increase values and make all properties better. CI.
