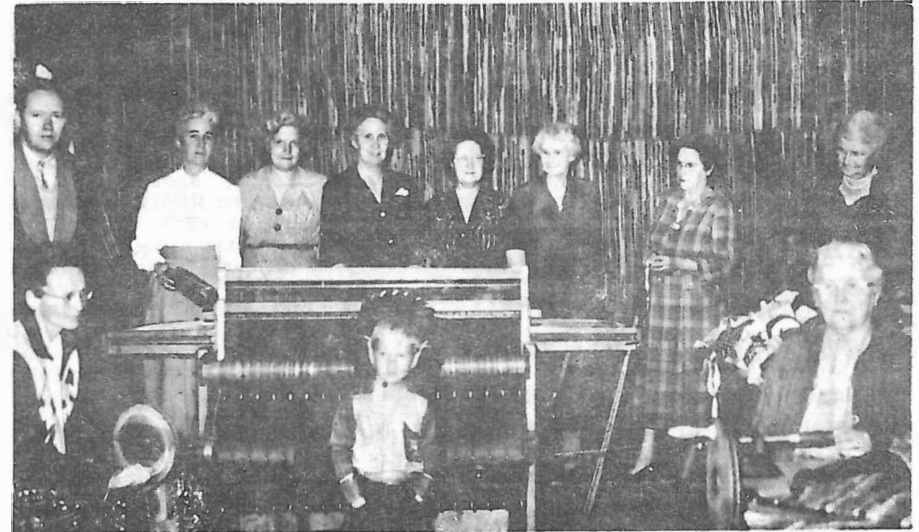
**Y. C. TO SPEND ITS \$2,000.**

**Editorial...**

TELL ME WHAT YOU EAT AND--

A long time ago a wise doctor remarked 'Tell me what you eat and I'll tell you what you are'. He meant physically and mentally, for he knew that nutrition is the key to health and longevity.

Two recent news stories bear out this fact which has been ridiculed for decades, but which, had it been observed, thousands might have lived a well rounded life--free from ailments and lack of energy.

One was from Denver, by Capt. Jerome A. Moore of the Navy, who told the Aero-Medical association that proper food for pilots will help prevent air accidents. That would apply to every other phase of living. He told of a food program at Cecil Field, Fla., which trimmed 17,000 pounds of excess weight from 1300 persons!

'Overweight, 'he said 'a manifestation of improper eating habits is a precursor of many of these conditions decreasing a pilot's efficiency'. Autopsies have revealed that coronary thrombosis suffered by fliers has caused some plane accidents.

The other is from Dr Frank Gardner, Harvard Medical School, who said a major change should be made in our eating habits; that butter, oleo, and other fats are dangerous to the circulatory system.

He also pointed to the distinct relation between long time cigarette smoking and lung cancer, the most serious type of that dreaded ailment. -CI

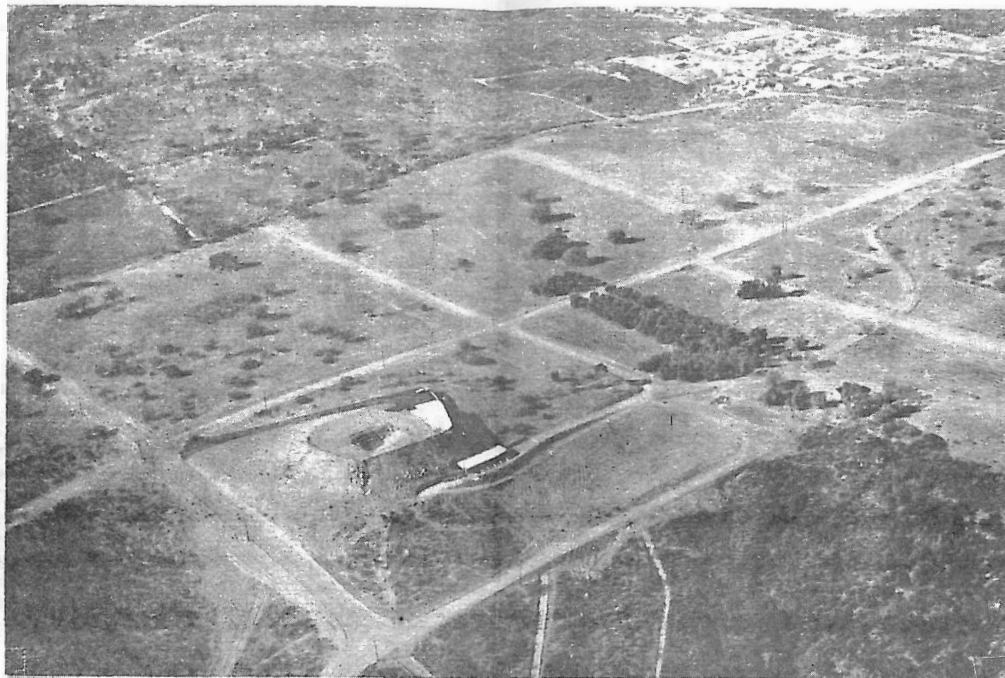

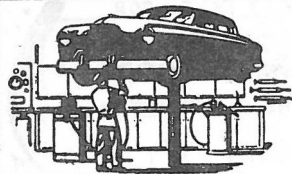
Mrs. Morris Hettinger had a plastic party and tea at her home and Mrs. Bob Mendenhall received guests at a Stanley party.

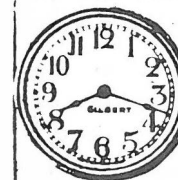

For many years and prior to the formation of the Alpine Fire protection District, when calls were made to report a fire the operator turned them over to La Mesa Forestry or El Cajon. But now, due to the Sun's campaign to get faster service, the phone company, reports W.H. Rank, E.C. manager, routes calls direct to the Alpine fire station, HI5-2343. This applies only when a person wants to report a fire in Alpine, not just the HI5 area. However it is best for one to call direct to the Alpine fire station. The sun prints emergency numbers frequently, but you should have that number, HI5-2343 posted near your phone, or even written in red on the wall! Remember, in any emergency, every second counts.

Note- And if you do not have your house number in plain view, that might delay help in case of emergency. All houses here have been allotted numbers; if you don't have yours, better check.
