





He had taken off from Pomona at 11:30 p.m. for S.D., but was fogged out at Lindburgh, could not get in at Gillespie, where he had landed two days previously for the same reason. He crashed a few hundred feet from Mrs. Don Fuller, Marie, has the reservation where a landing strip is being sought by the Sun.

Note- This crash underscores the need for a landing strip here, which the Sun has been trying to get for five years. I started the Alpine Flying Club to help promote it, but it is hard to have a club without a place to take off and land. We have had one near fatality and 6 or 8 forced landings in 8 years. How many more must die to prove that Alpine, safe above the fog, should have an airport or an emergency strip. Once we get the land, we are sure of getting official aid. - CI
