a lift to impoverished districts. In our case, for only 6¢ more, we can construct all the new class rooms now needed to end double sessions and put the school on a full day schedule.

'In other words' he illuminates, 'if voters approve, their tax burden will increase from $39 \, \phi$ to $45 \, \phi$ and can not go above $45 \, \phi$, regardless of the money in the bond election or the state apportionment. Whether or not we will be able to cut the other tax of \$1.51 and thereby of fset this $6 \, \phi$ increase, is a matter the board should consider in the future'.

The PTA is backing the election, plans to carry all the facts direct to voters, as the urgency of the measure is apparent.

On Aug. 26, the board will open bids for the two new rooms recently allowed by federal funds and work should start soon with the space ready by January 1958. (See editorial, Page 2)
