TWO CHARGES ON HALLBACH

Wilbur Hallbach, former Alpine school bus driver, was taken into custody on Thurs. Sept. 12, at his So. Grade home by Marshal Joe Rogers, of Municipal Court, E.C., later released on \$50. bail on each warrant.

DISTRICT MAY LOSE CHANCE TO GET STATE AID MONEY

The Alpine Union School District, governed by the board of trustees, Alpine, will not vote as planned on Oct. 15, for the \$125,000. bond issue in order to qualify for a new state-aid law which would have yielded funds for new classrooms.

This was decided at the last session, reports Supt. David B. Everett who says "We do not feel it right to ask voters to sign a blank check for this bond issue, at least until the law is clarified".

auditor having indicated that the 45¢ limit enacted by the last legislature does not apply to payments on local bonds. However, Grossmont and Santee are going ahead with their elections.

enlarging prosperity circle and wishes it had water. Each year we pay many thousands on wells, some good, some bad. I spent \$835. deepening one to 245 feet, got no moisture. That hurt. Many hereabouts have spent much more and found no water.

Some time ago Jim Rorie went to 505 feet to regain water at a cost of \$3721. to supply his Associated service station and his home. Recently the Log Cabin Cafe spent a lot going farther down to keep its supply up. Bob Wilson, owner of cottages and a service station downtown is drilling now.

O.E. Jordan, my nextdoor neighbor, has hauled water for some months, just spent \$1,000. drilling, got a mere dribble. My other neighbor, Ralph Frey, is hauling it, plans to drill soon.

H.A. Bestwick, head of B & R Drilling Co., in E.C., one of the largest developers of water in the Southwest, tells me there is still plenty, but at 1200 feet and more, a costly task that may run well over \$15,000.

Tenants were recently forced to vacate Spear's Cottages because of water failure. Luckily the remedy was found in a plugged lateral. Now they have a fine supply. But our water table is steadily dropping. We have a half-million dollar investment in a new school which depends on one well. If that goes dry, what then? I am told that it now takes much longer to recover. Use is increasing daily. Taxes and insurance are higher because we are lower in water.

New investors here want water; have told me they would go along. There is hardly a rental around here, because we have slim water. Get it and we will have a bank-badly needed-- more business, loans, building, FHA, progress, agriculture, prosperity.

Let's get into the water system that will raise land prices from a few hundred an acre to as high as \$5,000 and up as it did in Rancho Santa Fe, Poway, Johnstown and elsewhere! -CI
