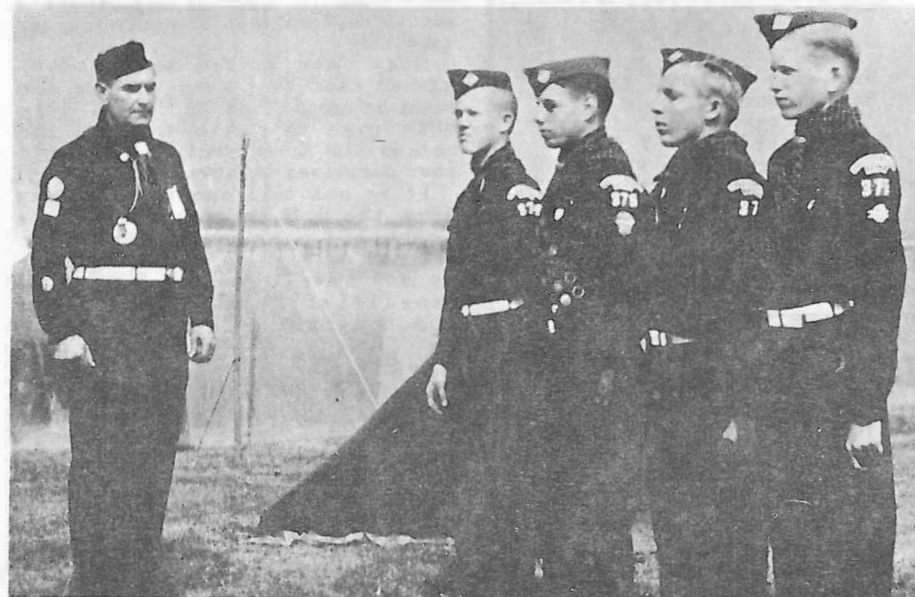

million votes for that office. He plans to be on the June 3 primary.

His program highlights the need to strengthen powers of local boards and superintendents as opposed to state controls. All this with lower building costs, will help put an end to double sessions. He also criticizes state monopoly on textbooks.
