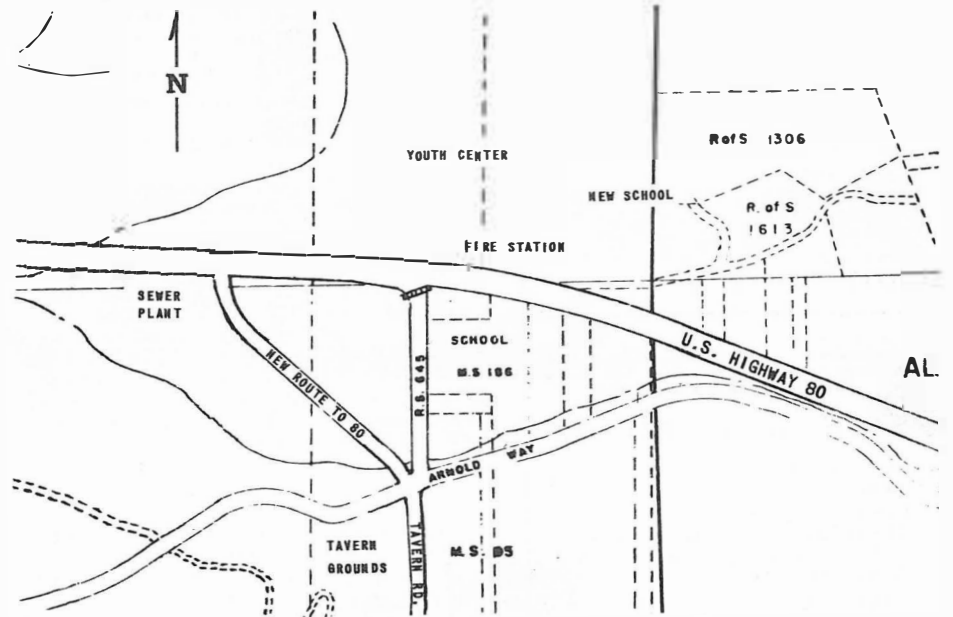

Editorial...

MacARTHUR SAYS TAX PERILS

One of America's greatest sons, whose stature will enlarge as time goes on Gen. Douglas Mac Arthur, last summer pointed to the present tax burden on the people as a very imminent peril.

He said that the government 'no longer believes free men can manage their own affairs pointing to the fact that taxes take over a third of what the average citizen earns in a year.

Present rising prices, inflated living costs and loss of individual freedoms, he added, all stem from the 'oppressive, exorbitant and confiscatory' levies by U. S. state and local governments. He thinks income tax laws operate like the Soviet forced labor system and reduce the citizen to long periods almost to involuntary servitude. He quoted Lenin who said in support of Marx that 'taxation with its offspring, inflation, is the vital weapon to displace free enterprise'.

He scored our swollen budgets especially national where figures keep growing astronomically, making more dents in the individual's budget.

While lecturing in the South Pacific before WW2, I had the honor of meeting Gen. MacArthur, then head of the Philippines, at the palace. He did everything to aid me in getting newsreel films of a world circling flight of British airmen, and I shall always remember the generous help he gave me and his fine gentlemanly cooperation.

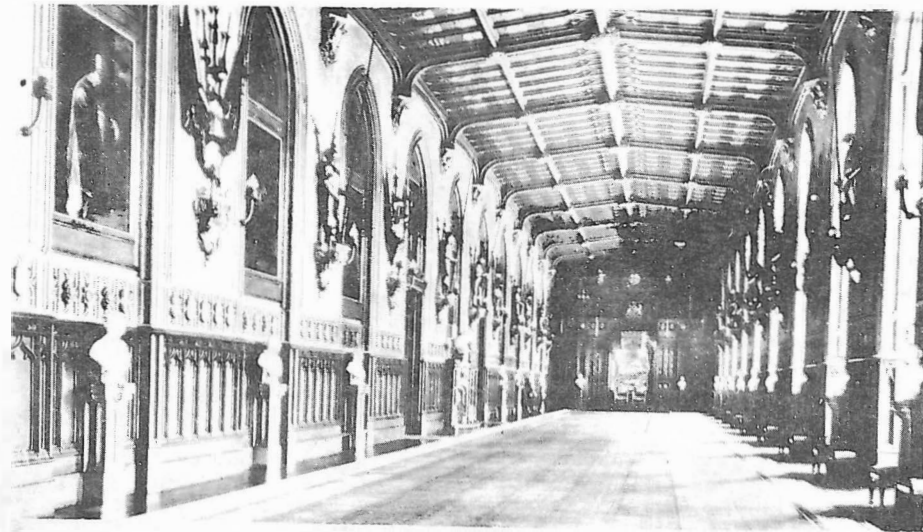

GLIDER EXPERT TO SPEAK HERE

James R. Spurgeon will present a thrilling program on 'The Art of Motorless Flight' at the monthly family dinner, Friday, Nov. 15th, at 6:30 p.m. in Fuller Hall.
