



ANCIENT ALPINE BUILDING YIELDS LITERARY TREASURES

Did you ever enter an ancient building and try to ferret out its history and background?
Such was our experience in browsing through the old winery in Alp ne at 2115 Arnold Way. The building must be close to a century old. Its architecture, size of the beams, its mustinessall speak of age. Accompanying buildings scattered about its sizeable acres smack of it. The old barn, moss covered huge slabs for sidings, old doors, battered binges.

Then wine flasks of all designs and sizes. Flagons hanging from the walls, large and ornate, in their shipping cases, still intact, One has a feeling that to burrow deep enough you would find a buried cache of rare old vintage.

Under the piles of old lumber, unused machinery, we unearthed box after box of books. The first things we laid our hands on were 2 bound volumes of Farmand Home', a weekly newspaper

Fooks on science, history, philosophy, with dates of early 1800. There is a Spanish pictionary, 1875, a history of Asia and India. There are history books from Persia and Peru.


