After tedious diamond drilling through hard blue granite, Kenneth Hittle of Butler Drilling Co.;


got a supply of pure water at 280 ft., for Bill Brown, manager of Alpine Branch, La Mesa Raalty, 2237 Hwy 80, on the property he

MOVE TAVERN PHONE POLES

With crews putting in new phone poles on Tavern Road at the north end, and the light company readying materials for switching their big poles to the outer edges of the new right of way, county road men will soon start big earth moving machines on this fine improvement, reports L.G. Schilbe, estimate engineer, who Monday gave the Sun some interesting construction figures.

Improvement will run 1.63 miles from So. Grade Road to Hwy 80 where the new route makes an S turn with a 90 degree angle into 80 by the sewer plant. It will call for 27,000 yards of excavation, removal of 55 trees, breaking up of 18 cu. yards of concrete culverts. A new bridge 32 ft. wide will span the creek. Over 3700 yards of base materials will be hauled in. There will be 25,000 square yards of oil pavement when through. Pipe for 262 culverts will be used in replacing 270 ft. of old culverts. Fences running 8500 feet will be removed and replaced along rights of way.

We were welcomed by the host Hugo Guenther, whose father founded the place many years ago, discovering it while on a horse and buggy trip to the country out of L.A. His son




At the meeting in Carlsbad last fall, Mr. and Mrs. Magnussen were elected secretary of their respective organizations.
