We should no more use oxen to draw our burdens than we should allow our schools to labor along on double-sessions.

BUS TRAGEDY IS AVERTED

The lives of five students and the driver of a school bus might have been the toll of a nearaccident Monday morning on a muddy road in Peutz Valley when the 42-passenger bus careened to the side, tipped, hung on the bank. But for a boulder it might have crashed down a 30-foot bank.

Fortunately the driver, James Johnson, was entering the valley to pick up on his regular run. Only five were aboard, of the 22 to be picked up. Rains of the night before had caused much silt to cover lower stretches.

"The road at that point was like ice" Johnson reported, "if I had applied the brakes it would have gone over the bank so I just let it slide to a halt'.

Due to double sessions four trips are made daily over this narrow and tortuous route. The leaning vehicle was pulled back by Alpine Motor Service. Fred Rushing was on hand to help, managed to get stuck himself. Later Johnson and Supt. David Everett also were stalled in a thick spot as was Editor Irvine in his 4-wheel press jeep.

By law we must transport children to and from that area" Everett told the Sun, "and on that county road I have no choice but to instruct the driver not to enter the area after a heavy rain. The solution is for the county to initiate improvements, the sooner the better. We won't have a serious accident or a death to convince officials that something should be done'.

The Sun 1 arned that petitions have been signed by residents of the Valley and that hearings have been held but so far nothing has been done.

Henry McKie, jr., former Alpine realtor, of S.D., is up after a month's bout with pneumonia He spent 10 days in the desert, now feels fine. He was at one time a hard working fire commissioner here.





forest, on the south and west by the new Dehesa Water District.

This official report comes from the office of Byrl D. Phelps, civil engineer, who sent the accompanying map to the Sun with these details.

"Property-owners in the area

have attended meetings " he says, "with the S.D. Water Authority, and their district is now before the Water Problems Committee". An engineering report will be made for the consideration of the board at their February 13 meeting.

"If this informal request meets with favorable consideration" he explains "necessary petitions will be circulated to hold a Metropolitan and s.D. County Water Authorities".

The Sun contacted Richard S. Holmgren, general manager and chief engineer of the authority, on the phone. He explained the matter, saying that the main item to consider is the pumping problem, the amount of water required and the assessed valuation. "A number of other areas adjacent are very anxious to obtain water" he stated, "so Alpine will have to wait along



with others." Besides, it will be some time before actual pumping would commence, a matter of perhaps three years, and only then if water were available.

When asked about the possibility of sea water, Holmgren said "At present that is too costly to bank on, at least in your area". As to solar energy distilling, he said it was fantastic at this time.

Note- Twice the Sun has tried to get a petition through to secure water, but twice too few realized the urgency, so nothing came of it. Today, however, there are many new, progressive people here who see the great need of ample water and who would sign for it. We hope that Alpine may come of age with the coming of water! -CI






