Soon the two new classrooms will be completed and children from crowded rooms and double sessions will enter for studies.

But the trouble is that we need four more, and right now. Supt. David B. Everett says 'In two years we have built four rooms without the necessity of a bond issue, but we must have four more

to get us all off double sessions'.

He points out that this school has risen from 300 to 614 today, without the bond vote, and the future promises steady growth in population, which means added students.

One point is that another four rooms can be erected cheaper than the others because no breezeways or restrooms will be required.

As parents who have suffered with the many others, along with the children affected, we trust that Alpine will at this time back our worthy school board and the superintendent if and when they ask voters to give the green light to such a much needed bond issue.- CI

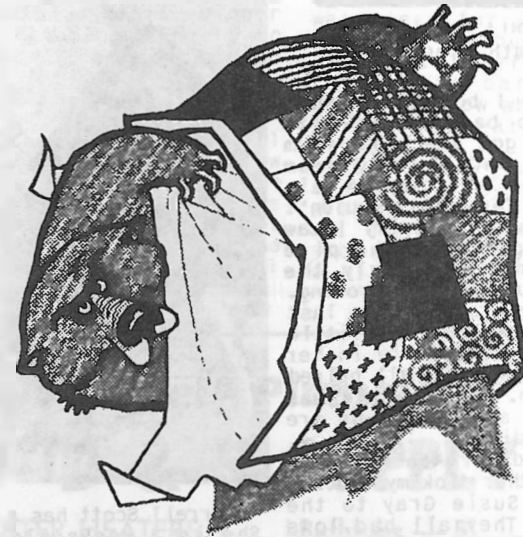
**BUILDS WELDING STRUCTURE**

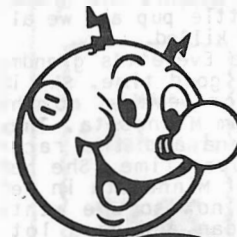

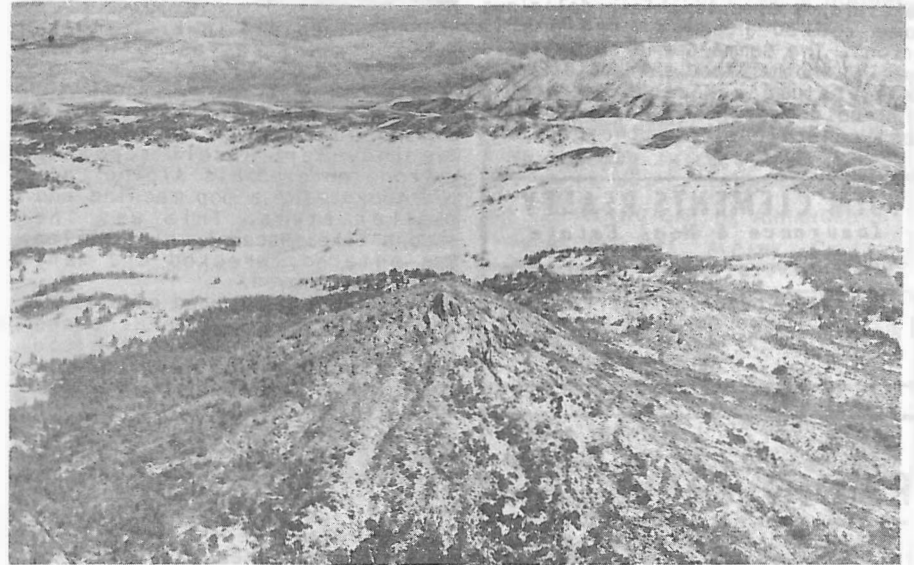

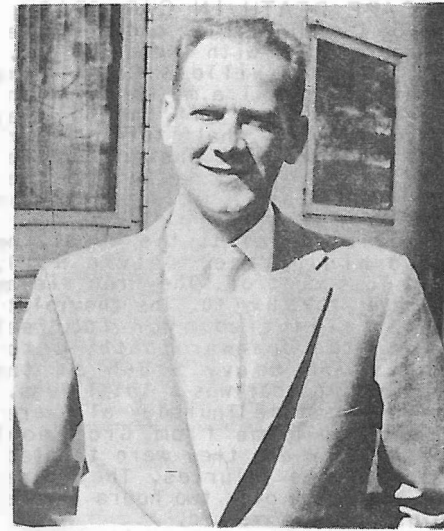
**EVERETT SPEAKS AT CAMPO**

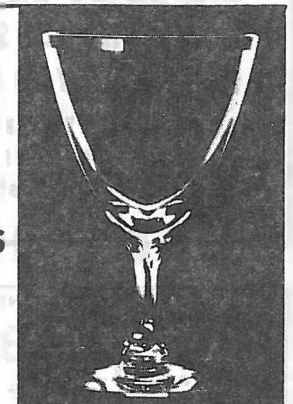

**ESCAPE DEATH IN CAR CRASH**  
Joe C. Homesley, who resides here, reported the wreck. The lad was found wandering around by E.L. Vardeman, of E.C., who reported it to the CHP.

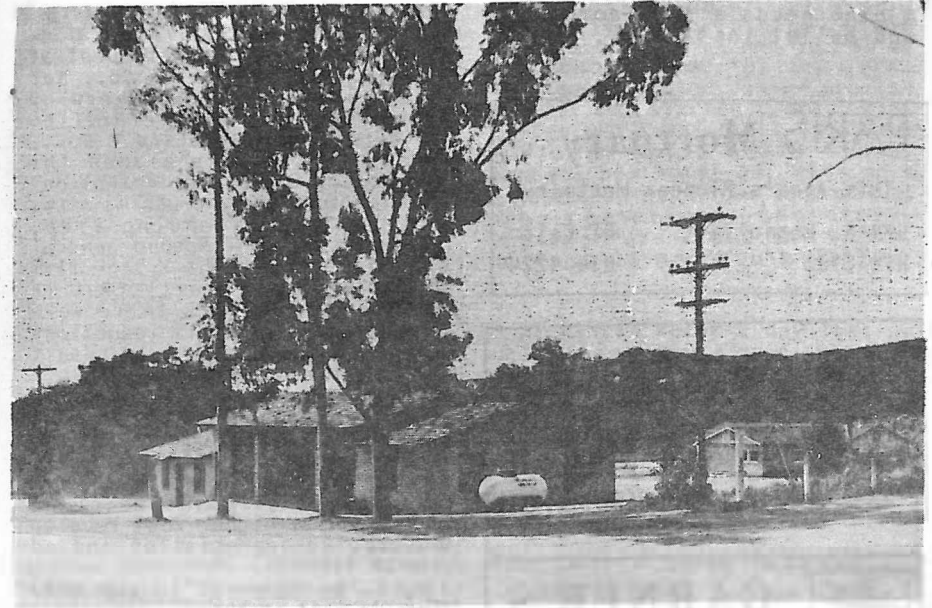

## POWER CO., HEAD EXPLAINS

Of interest to all in the back country is the current request of the S.D. Gas & Electric Co., for a rate increase. E.D. Sherwin, president, very well clarified the situation before the P.U.C., at its opening. He blames the "continuing effects of inflation" plus the terrific increasing needs of this fast expanding area.

This is only the second general increase to be sought by the firm since 1921— 36 years! "But in that period" he adds there were 13 major electric rate reductions made voluntarily or as a result of formal actions by the PUC."

The overall picture should allow the company an increase, economists point out, as the steady rise in costs as fuel, wages, supplies, materials and taxes. Another point is plant investment at higher cost levels, thus upping depreciation and ad valorem taxes.

Note— We have had to pay many rises in cost of butane, gasoline, and other things we use, to say nothing of the steady rise in taxes and living expenses.

Every businessman and every householder knows full well that we are in a rough sea of rising costs. We do not want our power company to fail in maintaining the fine service it has always given, so if a raise is necessary, which it certainly seems to be, we will go along with it. —CI

Here are various tax deadlines that you must watch in the next few weeks:

Mar. 10, 5 p.m.— Owner's report on tenants and furniture. This must be made or you may have to pay personal property tax on rentals.

April 1— 5 p.m. Business property statement, no matter what kind of operation, return must be filed.

April 1, 5 p.m.— Veteran's exemption. Must be answered yes or no on all queries, signed before deputy, 235 Highland, in E.C., Mar. 17 thru 28, 9 to 5. Offices also in Julian, Pine Valley & Ramona or San Diego.

April 10, 5 p.m. postmark— County taxes, 2nd half, now due.

April 15, 5 p.m. postmark. State and federal income taxes. Be sure your addition is correct, etc. send early as possible— if you have the money— so as to get earlier refund check— if it is due.

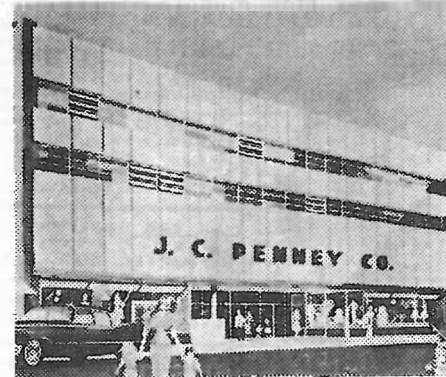

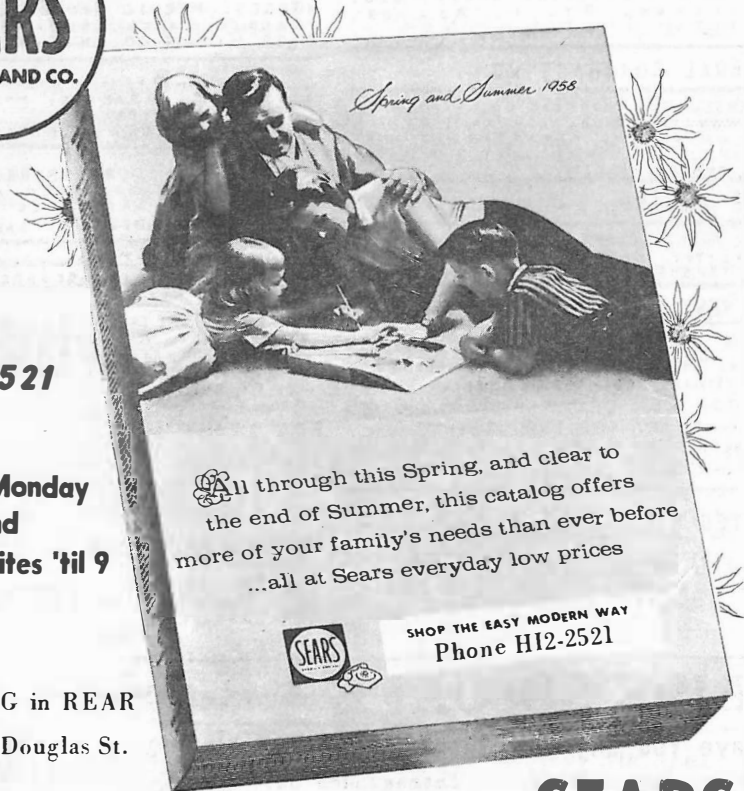
