
VOTE TUESDAY FOR SCHOOL BOARD







\$8,919 FUNDS TO SCHOOL

in Washington Rep. Bob Wilson reports that the government has earmarked more funds for Alpine's school district, under the law giving aid for schools hit by an influx of children of federal employes. The cash is for maintenance and operations.
