## EDITORIAL.

### HOUSE NUMBER COULD SAVE YOUR LIFE!

Monday noon a child was rushed to the hospital after badly injuring her foot.

Because the home had no house number on an un-named street-- Lilac Lane in Alpine Heights-- the El Cajon Ambulance Service told the Sun how difficult it was to find.

This delayed the run. Had the child been critically

injured, or had it been an adult in dire need of help, or had it been a fire, or need of a sheriff, the story might have been far different, even fatal.

It took the Sun over two years to secure house numbers and posting of streets by the county. Last year we suggested to a resident of Lilac Lane, which has a dozen or so homes on it, that they merely agree upon that name, submit it to the county and request it be posted and house numbers assigned.

Nothing was done. Now perhaps the good people will get busy. There are numerous other homes where numbers have been assigned but human nature being what it is, they have neglected to post their numbers. Let this be a warning. -C.I.

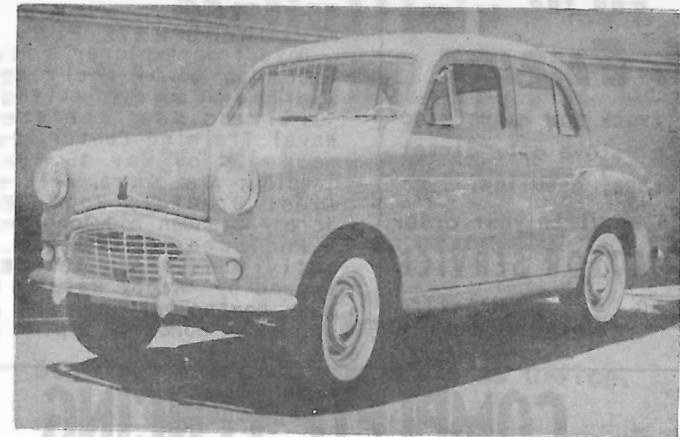

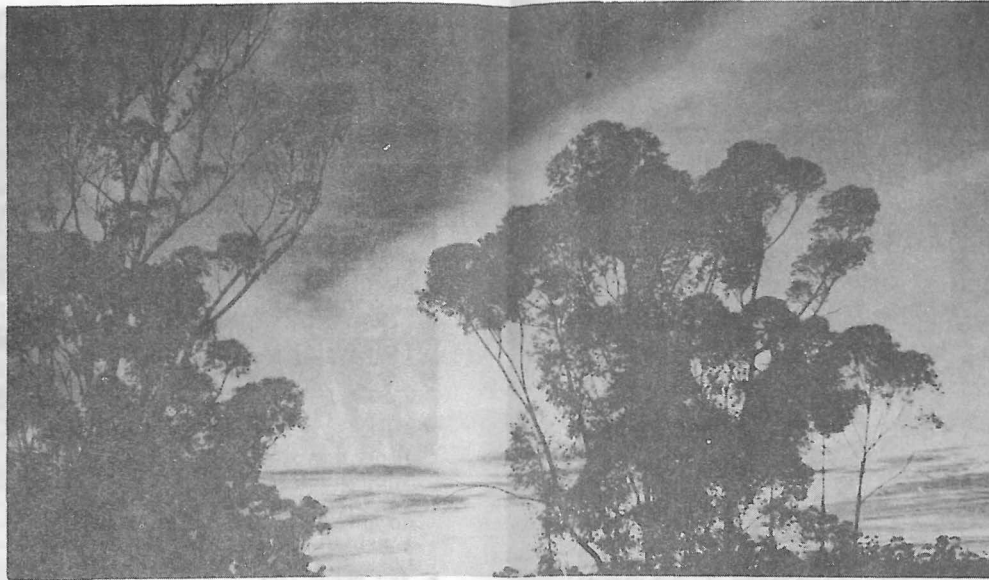
**CUB CIRCUS IS REAL FROLIC**
