For five months county road crews have been held up from starting work on the Tavern Road improvement from Hwy 80 to South Grade Road, because utility. poles have not been removed.

bull dozed the new strip from Arnold Way to Hwy 80 by the sewer. The present route will be abandoned. Old culverts were removed and new ones installed on the south portion, and this week 55 trees are being felled and fences removed.

Distance to be improved is 1.63 miles. It will require 25.000 square yards of new paving and 262 feet of new culverts, plus 8500 feet of fences. One huge 8 ft. culvert will replace the present bridge.

Ed flughes, construction foreman out of Lemon Grove and five workers are on the job. Earl Burnett, of E.C., is the shovel man. T.C. Lopez, former Alpiner, now of Lemon Grove, is flagman. Soon as poles are removed, heavy machines will start making detours so motorists can get around the road as it is torn up and rebuilt. Stop signs on Tavern will be changed to Arnold Way which has less through traffic.
