HELIX NIXES WATER

At the Monday night directors' meeting of Helix Water District, it was felt that, from the long look, their district presently would not accept annexation of the Alpine-El Cajon-Dehesa proposed water areas.

It was suggested that all three be annexed to the Metropolitan at the same time. Boundaries will have to be revised due to some residents not wishing to be included. The three districts will meet soon to discuss plans.

Preliminary estimates by Byrl Phelps engineers show that the cost of joining the Metro would be about 72¢ per \$100. assessed valuation. When water comes in, valuation will go up, which would reduce the costs proportion ately, probably down to 40¢.

A postal is being sent to those not desiring to be in, but should they wish to, they may return the card and get in. Deadline for this is Oct. 10.

Conclusion is that Alpine has a very promising future -- when it gets water, for with this ideal climate and rich soil, much could be grown year round, and building would advance instantly, with FHAloans, a bank and other improvements.

Due to four grades still being on double session here, the school trustees plan to request voters to approve a \$100,000 bond issue to finance part construction of new classrooms. They already authorized hiring an architect. New types of building will be carefully examined. Approval would allow Alpine to secure state funds.

Supt. Clyde Gilley says early studies indicate that a site for a new building would be in or near Harbison Canyon where a large portion of present en-

rollment comes from.

If a complete new plant is not deemed necessary, the elementary school here probably will be expanded, he said.




