## Shrinking American Dollar is a Dangerous Sign!



If government spending so far above income keeps up many more years, we are bound to go into a spin that will set records no one has ever dreamed of.

Some well remember those difficult days of 1907 when the panic hit and nobody had any money-- just scrip-- and not too much of that.

Most remember the days of 1933 when the banks were closed and business

limped along on promises, checks and trust.

And it was 29 years ago this month when the stock market crashed and with it business went out the window along with a lot of men who could not take it.

Today our almighty (?) dollar is worth only about 48¢ of what it was 20 years ago. Ten years past it was worth about 83¢. What will it be good for in another decade?

Federal spendthrifts keep passing out the money, increasing the national debt, borrowing more from the banks, allowing them to lend \$6. for each one in reserve.

Those who live on social security, capital savings, insurance, bonds or other fixed income, know that their checks shrink every time inflation hits the good old dollar. And it will buy even less as time goes on and living costs creep up and up.

Yes, round and round she goes and where she stops, no one knows!

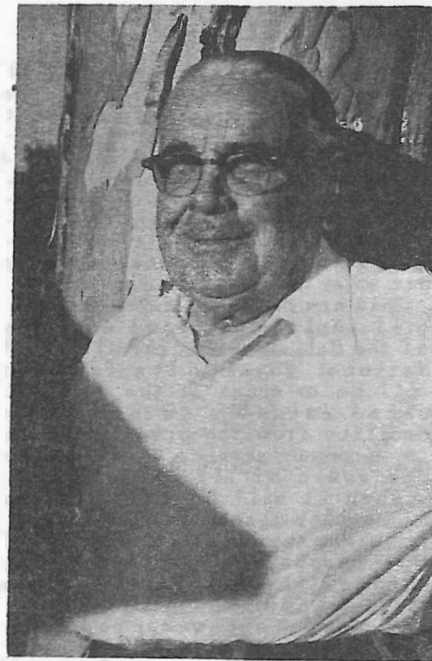

**New Water Deal On**

Since the Helix annexation deal was turned down as told in the last issue, cards have been sent out to the three districts excluded; Dehesa, El Cajon and Alpine, with a deadline of Oct. 10, for return of the card requesting inclusion in the proposed annexation to the Metropolitan. This would eventually put water into Alpine.

This new district, say engineers, will include all land easterly of the Helix area to the Cleveland National Forest. Its function will be to annex at the earliest date, extend a transmission facility from the present source to a common service point within the reach of all three areas.

Then it will be the function of another agency to buy, store, distribute and sell water. If the response to this mailing changes the boundaries, maps will be adjusted accordingly, and sent to the appropriate agency for consideration.

Note- The Sun has endeavored three times to get this action underway during the past seven years, and we might say that we are trembling with anticipation! Alpine will go far when water comes. -CI

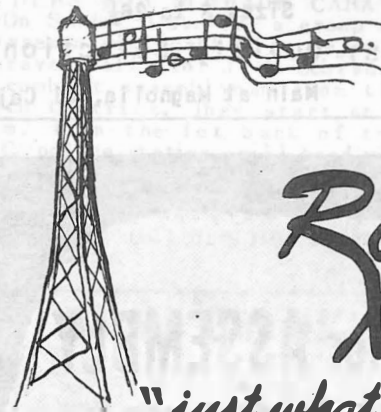

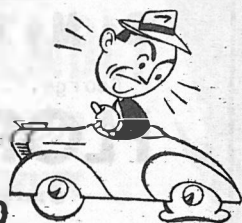

## Church School Due

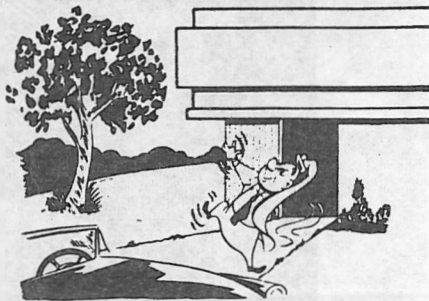

a man can be fleeced legally. It is the record of a zoning restriction that has made some good Americans bitter.

On July 3 P. S. Eiselstein and wife arrived here from Louisiana, chose Alpine for their future home. They bought a big trailer, moved to Trailer Estates, and on July 7 paid \$3500. for two acres at Victoria Drive and Holly Road, after Jim Pinkerton, Alpine Realty, told them it was unzoned. After the county also told him that early in July he spent \$400. on a well, \$210. on a pump and \$50. for a pumphouse.

The county said before he could get the trailer park building license, he would have to get a sewer percolation test and have the water analysed. He paid Fred Rushing \$350 for grading. Then \$270. for the percolation test and \$30 for the analysis. On July 23 the power firm took \$50. for a commercial pole and meter, and the

county accepted \$15 for the permit. On Aug. 4, the state building supervisor said the permit would be issued when health codes had been met with.

In the meantime aroused residents of the area took a petition to the supervisors and got through an interim zoning ordinance that stops all building for a year, except one house to an acre.

Eiselstein was given no notice of the meeting, had no way of defending himself. Up to Aug. 18, the county gave instructions for getting the permits. Finally on Aug. 28 the analysis went to the county and on Sept. 4, when no word had been received, he got a letter via the engineers that 'you cannot construct a trailer park'.

Attorneys told him he could take it to court and win, and the district attorney said that such an ordinance is not retroactive, but the retired minister, being of a peaceful nature, does not like to fight, so is listing the property and is leaving on Oct. 1.

'We would never enjoy living up there now' the couple says. It is interesting to note that they have a son in a service that we all pay for to maintain our freedom, Americanism, democracy, but unfortunately, sometimes brotherly love and justice are missing. Thus Alpine loses a nice couple that would have made splendid residents. As this situation is brought into focus, we hope county officials will somehow remedy it. To work a sort of fast switch on innocent newcomers, is not our idea of good Americanism.

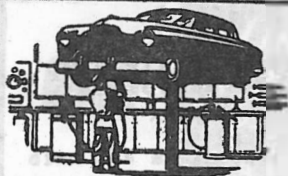

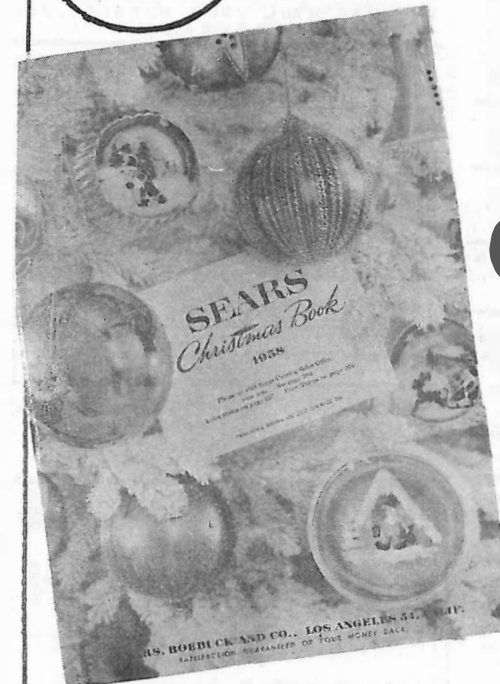
