Large Egg Operation Expanding Below Town

BY CLARKE IRVINE

When we attended county eggmen's third annual 'Good Egg' breakfast at the Town & country Hotel in S.D. and heard of the tremendous strides made in egg production in this county, I resolved to do an egg story for our big Christmas issue.

Dr. Cliff Carpenter, Chicago, national figure in the industry was speaker with an enlightening talk on progress here and abroad. It is surprising to learn that eggs is this county's first agricultural effort, with a take of \$17 million, by 600 producers for 1957. Hart Dunham deftly ran the show with a Will Rogeresque touch to his flashing humor, which kept many VIP's, plus press, TV, Radio and newsmen laughling.

Shortly after I found that

four top level eggmen had started one of the real big operations right here at Alpine on 240 acres a short mile north of Hwy 80 on Gavin Road. It is an ideal spot, 1900 feet above the sea, sheltered from brash winds by El Cajon Mountain.

The men behind it are Frank Hobel, of La Mesa; J.B. Pruett of E.C., his daughter Theresa was the 'slick chick' in egg promotion; C.S. Rigney, of La Mesa and D.O. Wright, of FC.

The firm is known as Today's Egg Farms, Inc., Armiss Whited is resident manager. They began building in Nov. 1956, will finish in three years when their goal of 100,000 layers is reached. First chicks were put in on Dec. 28, that year. They employ only three women with two carpenters and three

laborers, as all is run by the latest electronic automation. The builders will finish within three years. . • My host on the tour was D.O. Wright and in our press jeep we went over the whole site. even to parts where he had not been. Asked about the huge sheds, he revealed 'every two months we put in 6,000 young layers. Ultimately we will have 16 laying sheds'. Plans call for two brooder

houses and four growing sheds to feed young hens into the

layer groups.

'Yes, this automation is something' he said as we stood watching the uncanny handling of fresh eggs by delicate metal fingers, rollers, etc. 'The capacity is 20 cases an hour, all cleaned, graded, packed and tabulated.'

One part of the project is the processing where eggs are

cooled, with humidity and temperature control, thence to the machine and whisked into refrigeration then to market daily.

'We have no retail sales' Wright says 'and of course no visitors', hence so few know of this big project which took many months to tie together,

Being members of the coop, the big tank truck 'Vitagold' feeds and keeps hoppers filled. From these the feed is all automatically sent to each hen.

So is the water.

When a brush fire swept all but 40 acres just after they started, it came to within 20 feet of the laying house, but it was cool inside, as all are equipped with sprinklers. The climate of Alpine is noted to be specially healthful for chickens and turkeys.


CLEAN UP MAIL BOXES



Much Alpine History Centers on Indians

There are few Indians in these parts that know or remember much of the early history of the area, its tribes, settlers, legends. In her small history of Alpine, Beatrice La Force, former Alpine librarian, and playwright, has gathered many interesting facts. The old Indians had names for everything. Being outdoor lovers they observed all the phenomena of nature, the heavens, flora

and fauna.
Viejas, symmetrical old
mountain to the northeast of our mountain to the northeast of our village was named for a very good reason. It is a Spanish word meaning old women and there are several legends as to just how it got its name. One is that the valley atop this 4179 foot peak was the site of a camp where the women were left who were too old or feeble to make the seasonal travels.

Another version has this as the refuge for the old of both sexes, and the children in war times. while the younger folk

went out to battle, the women going along to fight as well as the braves.

The history explains that Tom Lucas, last of the Lagunas, gives his version of the name, as told by his wife, and Viejas means valley of the old or ancient. It seems that in the early days when the padres went to that location to get the young Indians and take them to the missions the word went ahead and when the priests reached here, there were no young anywhere.

The old Indian name was Ma-taerwa, meaning the big opening or wide open space, which aptly describes the present reservation here, also the wide

Butler was an expert in deep steam wells, having developed the geysers, 60 miles north of San Francisco.



Hospital patients per 100,000 population







If you have not driven out Tavern Road lately you have a big surprise coming. County roadmen have been working full time on the project from South Grade Road, over to Hwy 80 where the new entry comes in at 90 degrees above the sewer plant.

Heavy earthmoving machines, blades, and a large shovel have all been employed and the entire strip has been worked over with much blasting of boulders.

Two great improvements are the covering of the old bridge at the north end-- narrow and dangerous-- and Dead Man's curve by Gene Wilcox's place.

The wide, new, level straight road will be splendid when it is blacitopped. Ed Hughes in charge, and his crew have made fast progress on this primary county road, which carries a lot of daily traffic. (See pictures elsewhere).

NOTED VISITOR HERE


