**WATER STORY FROM PAGE 1**

The Sun received many compliments on it, but the best were from three area newspapers that rewrote its story.

The cost of water to the consumer, which did not arrive in time for last issue, shows that, for 1000 gallons a month, average for the small family, costs per month in these districts: San Dieguito, \$2.47; Lakeside, \$2.50; Poway & S.D., \$3.; Helix, \$3.10; Riverview \$3.70 and Valley Center, \$5.

C.R. Crull, associate engineer with Byrl D. Phelps, who is working on the matter, says that the price depends on location and size of district, that is, number of users, which reduces the cost.

Poway, one of the fastest growing areas with hundreds of new homes, pays only \$3., and for 5000 gallons a month, pays but \$8.50.

Crull adds that 'Alpine, when it does get water, will in all probability build more elite, ranch-type homes, instead of large subdivisions'. He adds that when water gets here, property values will rise rapidly and building will forge ahead whereas presently it is very small.

Richard Holmgren of the S.D. Water Authority says that the new map has been received and will be given final look-over at the meeting on Friday the 13th, will then be sent to L.A.

A rumor that Alpine Heights, (Navy Hill), where Alpine Heights Road runs, was not in the district, but engineers state that it is definitely included.

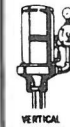
