IT HAS BEEN SAID THAT DRINKING IS A MAN'S PERSONAL BUSINESS. BUT WHEN HE VEERS OFF THE HIGHWAY, STRIKES ANOTHER CAR AND KILLS NINE, INCLUDING HIMSELF-- JUST WHOSE BUSINESS IS IT?

CORONER A.E. GALLAGHER SAID

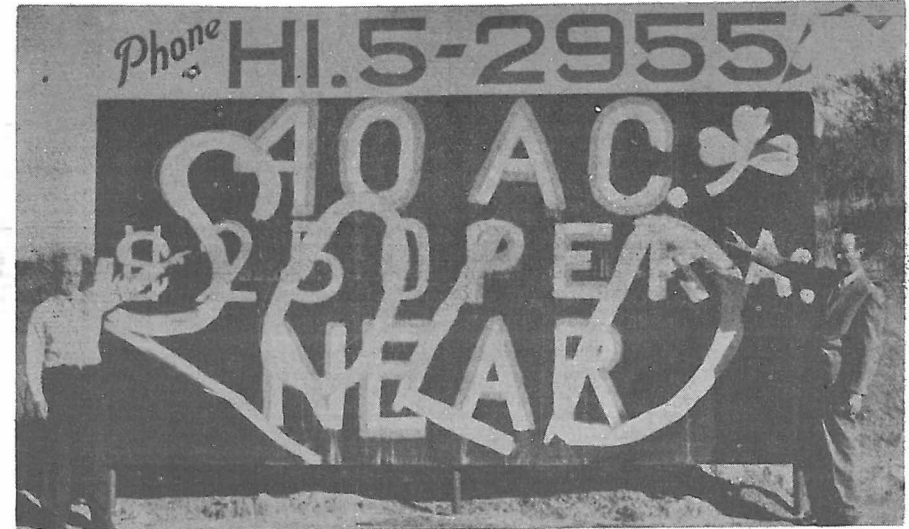

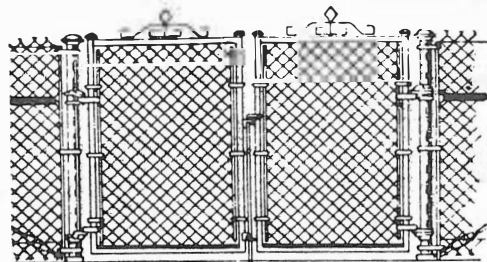

Know Your TEACHER

Among students in the old one-room schoolhouse on Tavern Road years ago, was little Winifred Green. As she gazed out at the familiar El Capitan mountain she never thought the day would come when she would return with her husband, Robert Earickson and their five children, and teach Fourth grade in a larger, more modern school..

Mrs. Earickson was born in South Bend, Ind., where her father was head professor of the Engineering Dept. at Notre Dame. The family came to S.D. when she was three, later moved to Alpine.

'My fondest memories of Alpine' she says 'are the times when I spent hours in the library or visiting with the librarian, Mrs. Young, who lived on Tavern Road. Also when my mother would send me to the old Tavern for milk or to Hilton's Alpine store'. She remembers the vivid headlines announcing the end of W.W.I.

Reed College in Portland, S.D. State where she graduated with a B.A. degree, specializing in teaching high school art. After teaching first grade in Vancouver, Wash., she returned to State for another year, received her general elementary certificate. Her next position was in Brawley.

The Earicksons were married in 1941, made Yuma their home until they came to Alpine three years ago. They have five children, Elaine, melody, Joyce, Eugene and April. Earickson is a Civil service employee with the Navy. They planned and designed their own home, just off Victoria Drive.

Mrs. Earickson is interested in art as a pastime, but mostly, she enjoys 'being with her family and just plain living in Alpine'. With April and Joyce just home from the hospital, she has taken a temporary leave of absence from school to be able to nurse them back to health.

millions of dollars in fine back country property, would mean an instantaneous and surprising development.

This was revealed at the last session of the S.D. water Authority which accepted the rich Blossom Valley area below here, for annexation to the Rio San Diego Municipal Water District.

The authority also set boundaries for a proposed East County Municipal Water District, to serve some 38,000 acres from E.C. to east of Alpine! This is the biggest water idea that has ever been put forth in the foothill section. The entire area proposed covers a population of over 5000, assessed at \$6 million.

Chas. R. Crull of the Phelps office, handling Alpine's engineering job, says by combining forces this way it would save huge costs in transporting lines and hurry the day water will be available. After voters pass the issue, the work would be speeded, then distribution lines installed here and a reservoir, or two put in, and Alpine could start growing! Vote could come by August.

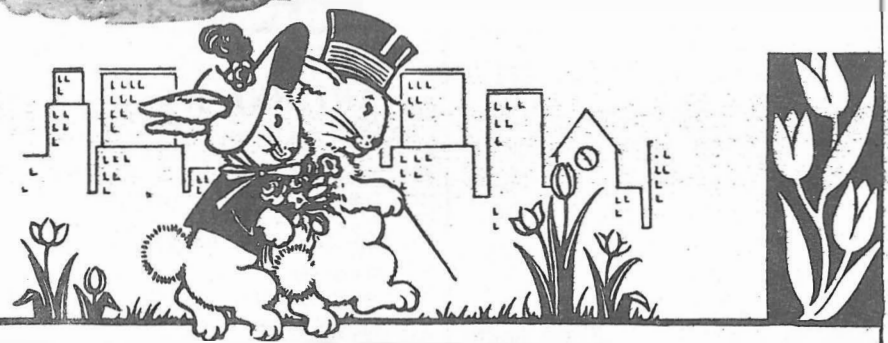
