
Chicagoans Plan Fine Home

Why a Full Site for Only 8
Rooms? It is sound to plan
ahead due to area growth; full
need will be required. Land
costs less now than later.
Site development delayed will
have to be financed locally,
as state aid cannot be used
then. Present plans will
provide acreage and utilities
adequate for complete elementary plant. Expansion later
will cost far less per room as
basic facilities will have
been provided.

Why \$250,000. Bonds & \$1 million from State? Present legal rules limit Alpine to \$126,000, which would be applied to reduce existing state loan. The state would then furnish the total necessary for building program. Assuming this to be \$300,000. it would leave a balance of \$124,000, on the bonds, \$700,000. on state apportionment. This does not mean the board gets a blank check as laws control such use.

What Are Legal Restrictions on Use of Monies? Bonded indebtedness cannot exceed 5% of assessed valuation. So no more than \$1.6,000. in bonds can be marketed now, nor till some current bonds are retired or assessed valuation increases. Bond money cannot be used for any purpose not stated in election call. Unused part of state money cannot be used till number of pupils requires more facilities, determined by state rule on maximum square feet per pupil.





Andrew Wikholm, principal of Descanso elementary school was speaker. Wikholm gave an enlightening talk on the education of mentally retarded children.





ALPINE SCOUTS IN SURVEY

Scouts of Troop 105 had as their guest Monday John Hunter from the Survey Research Center, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. The university is conducting a national study of Scout troops for the purpose of getting the scoutmaster's re-action to the troop and the boys' reaction to the scouting program - whether or not he thinks scouting is good and whether it should be continued.

SCHOOL BOND STORY FROM PAGE 1

When enrollment rise requires more facilities, added bonds will be sold, but never exceeding 5% of valuation. Proceeds are applied to existing state loan and funds for building are drawn from credit balance of that loan. It may be repeated till bonds or state apportionment are consumed.

Why Bonds and State Apportionment More Than Present Need? State-aided districts find it near impossible to avoid half-day sessions if they must use lengthy procedures of election and planning every time they need rooms. Much is saved by fewer elections. As in the past, state funds may be exhausted. But when approval of apportionment is made, money is always available as needed. No interest is paid on unused parts of issue or state funds. It cannot be used till needed. The law was enacted for specific benefit of such districts as Alpine.

Why Not Build with Local Funds, Avoid State Debt? It is obvious that financial status cannot provide facilities from own resources. Local taxpayers have made their contribution to state building fund, are entitled to state aid. Interest is lower on state loans than on bonds. Any unpaid balance on state loan after 30 years is for-

given.


