Terrace Asks Zoning Child Molester in Jail

In the hopper down at Civic Center is a petition from residents of Alpine Terrace asking supervisors to pass a zoning ordinance for their area, the request having been made to Supervisor Dave Bird of this district. It was referred to the planning commission.

Main item is to ban all animals including fowls, except dogs and cats, on the grounds of sanitation and road destruction. The letter was signed by these residents and their wives: Hugh Trail, Roy Setser, Isaac Chutor, Robt. Beaubelle, Wm. C. San soucie, Joe Latham and Marjorie L. McClurken, J.N. Miller and Marjorie J. Root.

Office of the planning division informed the Sun that the entire community of Alpine will be up for zoning 'before the end of the year'. Presently being completed are Poway, Fallbrook and Santee, with Pauma Valley next and Alpine last.

Note- On Aug. 5th last the supervisors passed a one year interim zoning ordinance for Victoria Drive area to prevent a trailer park being completed by P.S. Eiselstein. Later it was amended for two years, so it is covered till Aug. 5, 1960, when the entire community will probably be zoned.

Held in county jail following his pleading guilty to a charge of vagrancy child molesting in Alpine involving small boys of two families, is Don Deskins, of De Witt Terrace, who had been working as gardener and yardman in Alpine. He was certified to superior court for a sexual psychopathic hearing next week. Outcome could be committal to a state institution or a fine of \$500. or 6 months in jail, or both.

Note- Sheriff's office advises parents to always be alert, to warn children, and to use extreme care in knowing just where theirs are at all times. If anything untoward happens or is even hinted at by a minor, make an investigation and advise an officer at once. Do not fear adverse publicity as it is far worse to let it go with the result that some child might be harmed, even killed. In most cases names of children and parents are withheld for any news release. Ed.

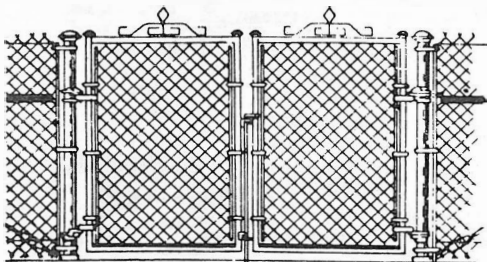

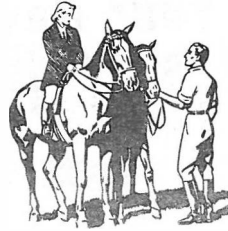
RUSHINGS WELCOME BOY

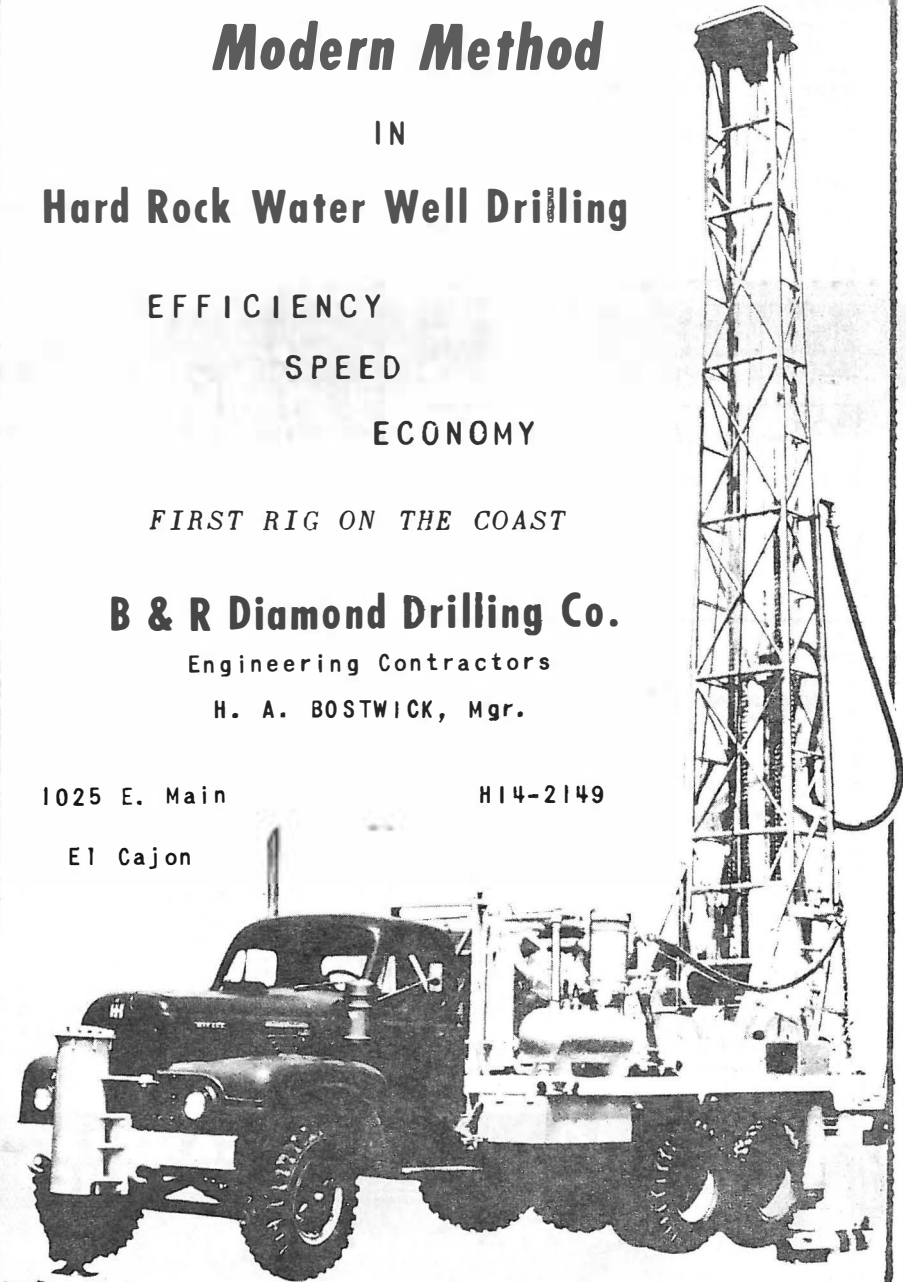

Water Table Lowering

Reports from many areas hereabouts indicate that the dry season has taken its toll of surface water, even once high producing deep wells have gone down considerably. For over 10 years there has been continuous drought with the exception of one season, 1958, which scored 23.99 inches.

Here is the official record from the Sun as of July 30, (end of the season):
1953... 13.36, 1954... 15.60.
1955... 11.01, 1956... 11.18,
1957... 14.41, 1958... 23.99
1959... 8.36.

Even in the mountains, at Green Valley Falls, springs have dried up and campers have no shower or laundry supplies till a new well is finished. However, better than close the park, the state is keeping it open with sanitary facilities, drinking and cooking.
