EDITORIAL.

Faulty Voting Law Lets Burden Fall on Taxpayer

The present water problem here points to the fact that what may be legal is not always what is right and fair.

It seems that anyone residing in an area, if a registered voter, although he owns no land and pays no taxes, may cast a vote to burden his landlord, and other property owners in the district, with bonds for schools, fire departments, sewers and water districts, that he does not desire.

The owner of the land has

only one vote, perhaps against many, to use against a system that might undermine his finances, burden his property with taxes for many years, and otherwise unjustly burden him.

This week Alpine is voting on annexation to a water district, and anyone registered to vote, may thus cast a load on the taxpaying property-owner, who might be against such annexation. But that is the way the law goes.

Perhaps it is high time that some pressure were brought to bear on legislators to change this arbitrary law that allows a stranger, a mere transient, to come in and say just how one's money is to be spent.

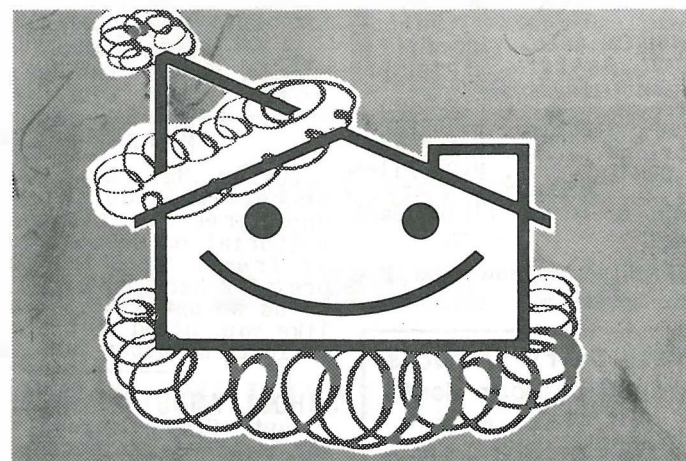

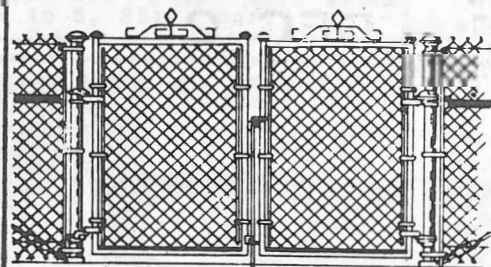

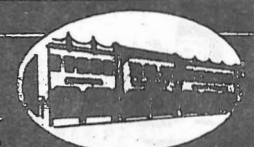

Alpine Ups United Fund

United Fund today flew into the final week of its one annual campaign to support 97 local and county health, welfare and social service agencies.

Alpine made its contribution to the success of the current drive by giving \$849, compared to the \$570 asked as a quota.

Led by Renie Hollett of 2649 Hwy 80, local campaigners have hit 148.94 per cent of their goal.

Spurred on by a record tying \$175,000 gift from employees at Convair-San Diego through their Contrib Club, the campaign total swelled past the \$2½ million mark and into the 80% bracket.

Another big gift to swell the record total from the SD Gas & Electric Co., Employes' Contrib Club.

Their contributions were \$35,000 although Jack Loftus, chairman of the club stressed that

the club, stressed that this was only an initial pledge, that more would be coming.

10-Year-Old Headliner No Novice in Game

ALPINE— Little Cynthia Irvine, 10-year-old fifth grader, is making headlines regularly.

She writes them in her father's newspaper here. And she is no newcomer to the game either. For the past three years, this energetic lassie has been turning out her column in the *Alpine Sun*, owned and published by Clarke Irvine.

Cynthia was born in Hollywood,

Oct. 9, 1943, but she didn't like the smog so she moved to Alpine with her family at age two months.

The clear air and beautiful country of Alpine had their inevitable influence upon her. She became an outdoor girl with a love for horses. When asked how long she had been interested in horses, Cynthia replied, "since I was in kindergarten."

Dream Came True

Last year her dream of a horse

of her own came true. Cynthia named him *Lightning* although his age would seem to deny the implications of the name. When first acquired he was just skin and bones, her father related, but Cynthia sees that he gets plenty to eat.

"He's an awful lot fatter'n when I got him—I bet he's gained 50 pounds," she said.

When asked whose idea it was for her to be a columnist, she immediately replied, "Oh, Daddy's. He said I should start a column, so I did."

Having started when she was in the third grade, she is now a veteran columnist at the age of ten. Her column, "Small Talk," appears in every issue of the *Alpine Sun*.

"Small Talk" is concerned with the activities and events important to the *Alpine Union School* children. Cynthia used to do all the work herself, gathering the news as well as writing it.

Now, however, she receives help in acquiring newsworthy events from her younger twin sisters, Celeste and Cecile. They are her "legmen," but Cynthia still does all the writing.

In Column, Too

Her interest in horses creeps into her column frequently. "Sunday Daddy and the twins went to look at the new road in the back pasture and Celeste saw Elaine Earickson's horse. She went over to pet him. She had on a red sweater and Sandy doesn't like red so he bit her on her left rib. It turned black and blue and now Celeste doesn't like him."

The column also reflects children's interest in animals of all kinds. "Mary Eva Fitzgerald's baby white cat had to go to the vet. It had a bad tooth and the doctor had to drill through his face to fix it. It is home now and getting fat."

"One of Melody Bates' banty chickens had babies and they are as cute as the ones I had."

Writing is not the only aspect of newspapering which interests Cynthia. She also uses a camera and is now learning the art of developing and printing pictures by helping her father in the dark room.

Her newspaper work doesn't prevent her from having a variety of other interests. "I'm gonna raise a lamb for 4-H," she confided,

"Mother finally said I could. I had chickens before."

Her favorite subjects in school are spelling, arithmetic, and art. "She has always got all A's and B's in school," her mother said. "And she draws all the time; her work is all over the house, pictures of horses!"

Piano Lessons

At the present Cynthia is taking piano lessons which she started about the time she started her column. She takes square dance lessons, too, and is a member of the *Girl Scouts*.

Because of her interest in art, she is going to begin drawing lessons. In the past she has taken ballet and tap dancing.

Her plans for the future include horses. "I'd like to go to college and then train horses or just have some," she said smiling.

Learning to type is also on her agenda for the immediate future, an indication that the little columnist intends to continue her writing activities.

It seems fitting, too, that the *Alpine Sun*, America's Tiniest Newspaper, should have the country's smallest columnist.

Vonnie Greathouse had to have her finger lanced. She hurt it and it got infected and was sore.

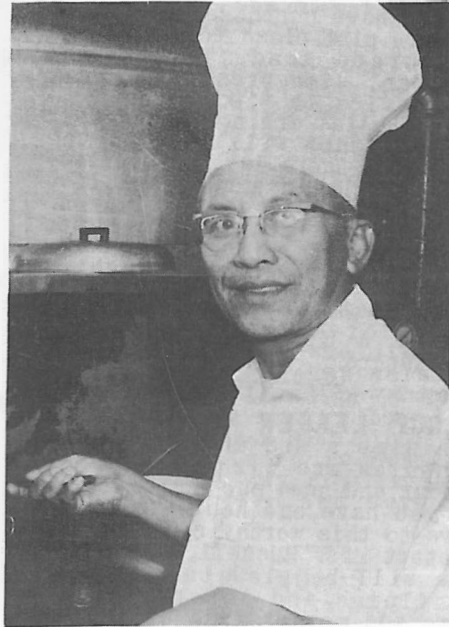

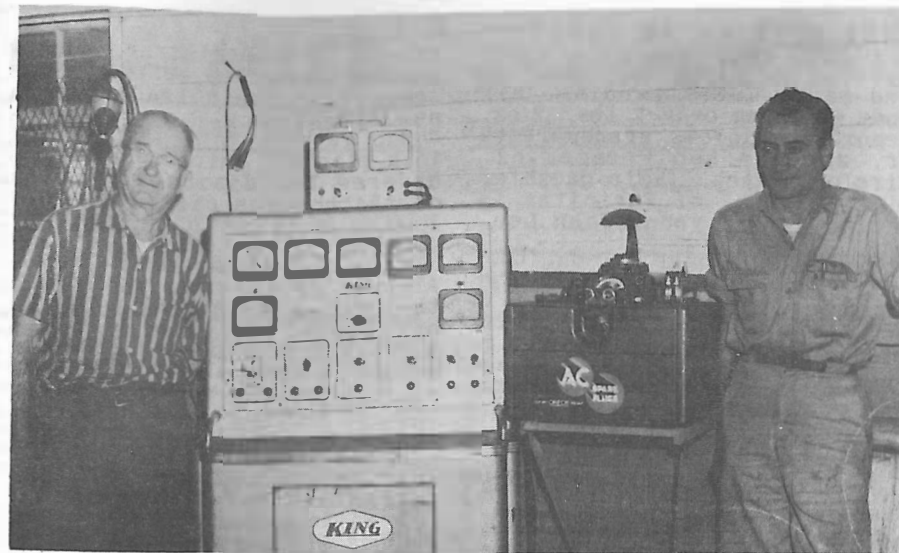

visors, vote registrar, county counsel and other officials are scratching their heads over a new situation.

Who gets to vote at the Dec. 15th election which supervisors ordered for disincorporation of the heights district, following a petition signed by 45 of the 134 voters.

It was reported that all Alpine, as annexed, would get to vote, but the Sun queried officials; the law does not know, but is studying it. Consensus is that only the district, at the time of the petition, could vote.

The Grand Jury came in, queried many, told us nothing that we did not know. It suggested wells for supply, but FHA will not make loans, and that is what we need to grow, get a bank, and improve. We felt that the jury was fair and impartial, did a good job.

Then the court restrained the committee from further investigation of Tuesday's election on Mrs. Kenneth Jerney's petition. Nov. 24th was set for a hearing when the jury must show cause why it should not be permanently restrained.

All Alpine has 1074 registered voters, of which 768 were eligible to vote on annexation, but only 455 chose to cast ballots. (Note editorial Page 2)

In a 'history of the East County project', a sample ballot was reprinted, resulting in Byrl Phelps, engineer, being charged under election laws, the hearing to be on Jan. 26.

As a propertyowner and publisher, I have worked for water since 1949. On Sept. 10, 1952 I printed a questionnaire for a proposed Alpine-Flinn Springs WD, but apathy precluded our going ahead.

Later I got out another, but still insufficient interest, till the East County began about three years ago. I want water! The Sun wants water!
