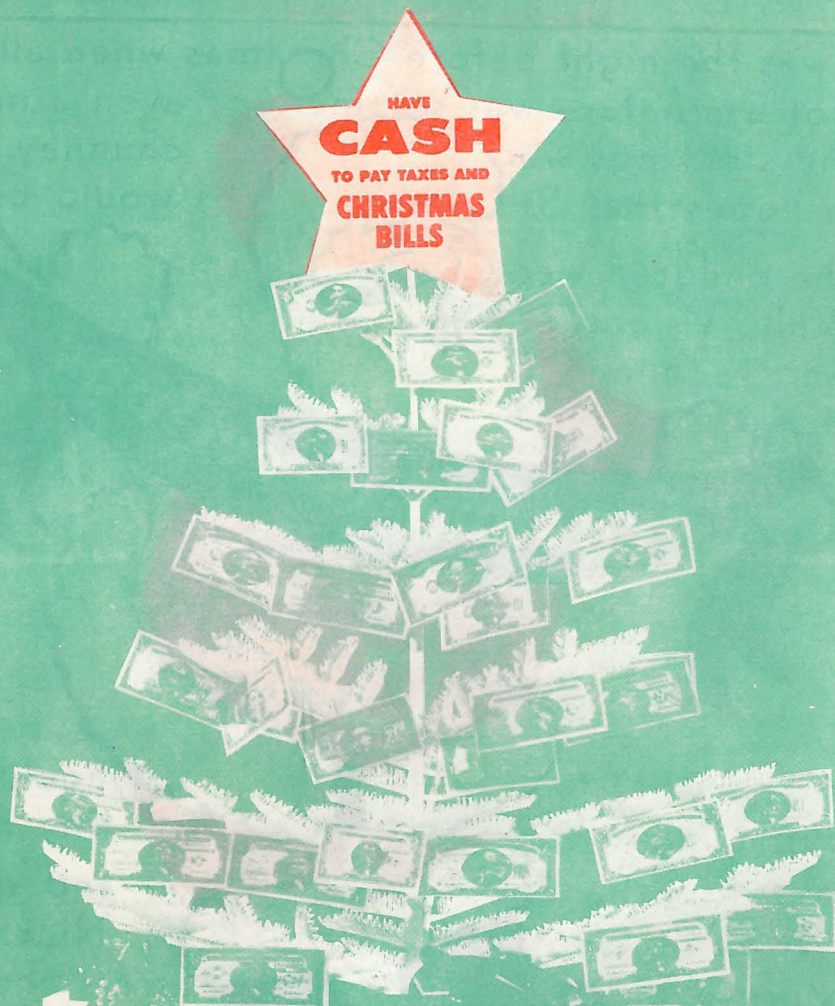

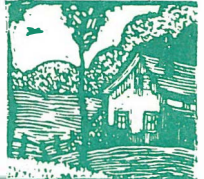

# 6 EDITORIAL.

## Tobacco Men Show Love of Money Still is Root of Evil

There have been many recent reports from cancer researchers on the relation of cigarette smoking to lung cancer.

Most recent was from Dallas where a new 5-year study proves it is not only a major cause, but its prevalence can be traced 'almost completely' to the number smoked by victims.

It was the first study in which tissue samples were used. The government has accused smoking of causing the disease. Said Surgeon-General Burney, 'unless the use of tobacco can be made safe (filters do no good) the individual's risk of lung cancer can be reduced best by eliminating smoking'.

In both cases the tobacco industry rose up in indignation! Jas. P. Richards, head of the Tobacco Institute reminds me a bit of Geo. Washington Hill, late head of a firm that started the advertising campaign to force girls and women to smoke. I classed him as America's

No. 1 criminal-- , but free of any charges.

The Bible tells us that the love of--not money itself-- is the root of evil. Smoking is an evil anyway you look at it. It undermines the health, stamina, blood, and causes many accidents and fires.

If it is a suspect, then it should be eliminated, for lung cancer is a growing national menace, 29,000 dying in 1956, and the curve is steadily upward along with the curve for use of cigarettes. Perhaps this is the right time to make one New Year resolution that may save a life! -CI

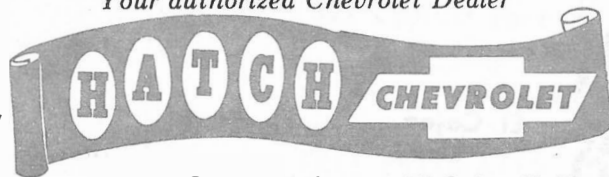

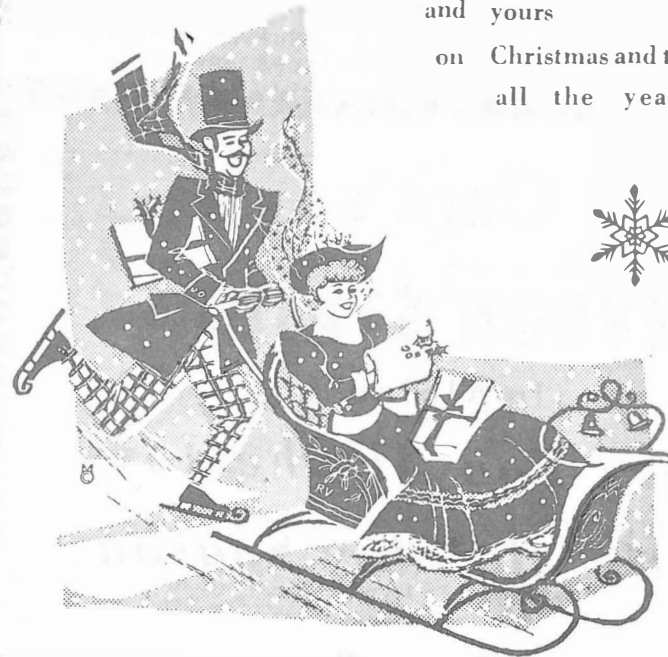

### Merril Couple Parlay Mimeograph into Big Business

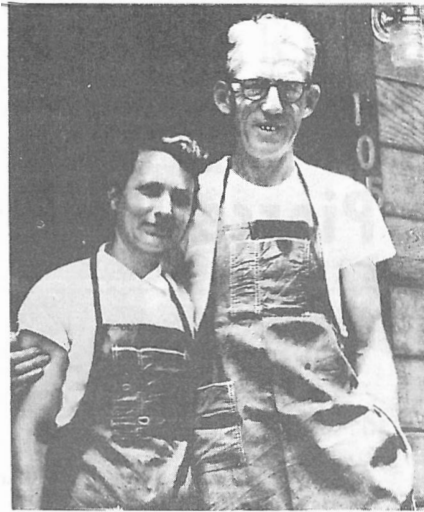

America is still the land of opportunity!

It takes a man, an idea, a few pesos and hard work--often aided by a good wife--to quickly make a success at most anything.

This is what Richard Merrill, 105 Willowside Terrace, has done in only 13 years, seven of them here. They have just built a new pressroom out of the garage, to house his two A.B. Dick offset machines which now turn out around 250,000 pieces a month which are mailed to patrons of groceries. And it is on the increase!

The Merrills came here from Chula Vista where they

started with a used hand mimeograph, operated in a spare bedroom, and they did not even own a car then. He had worked at Rohr Air-Craft.

'Six years later we moved up to Alpine' he adds, 'and we love it here. We serve grocers from Del Mar down to Imperial Beach, and from Ramona to the back country, including Alpine.' About 35 firms are clients, several having been with them for 10 years.

Now the shop is fully equipped with about \$25,000 worth of machines including complete air conditioners. The SCFL truck brings them a huge load of colored paper from LA every month, the largest load of anything that comes to Alpine.

These bulletins are printed somewhat like the

Sun, but no darkroom is used, just an automatic photocopying device which produces a printing plate ready for the press. Photos elsewhere show most of the operations. Dick does the layouts, runs the addresser, while his wife Ann is the pressman, and like the gun staff of two, work day and night to get into the mail on time.

Every week they have to get the market bulletins in the mail at SD, so sometimes all work far into several nights, and at times the automatic tying machine nearly gets a hot axle as it whirrs twine around the bundles, all addressed to each town and zone.

Grocery and other circular pieces go as third

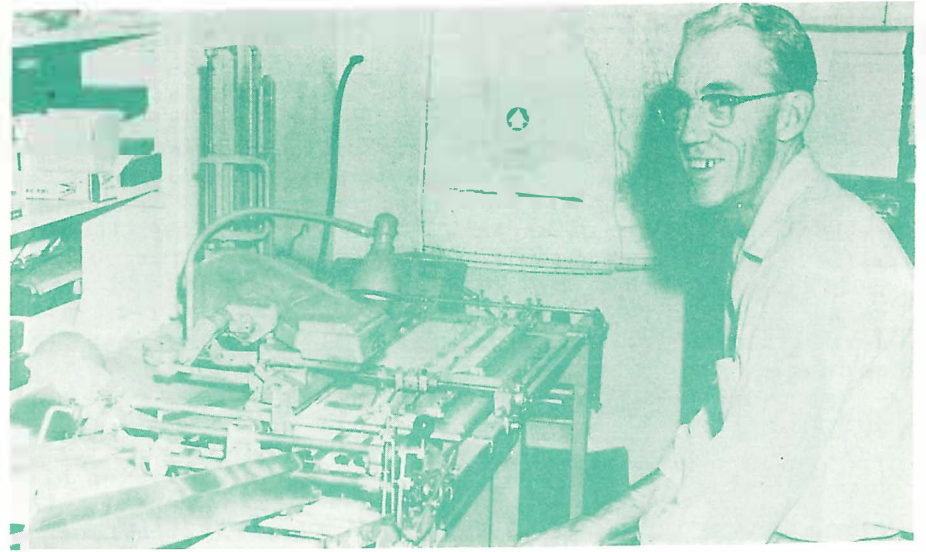

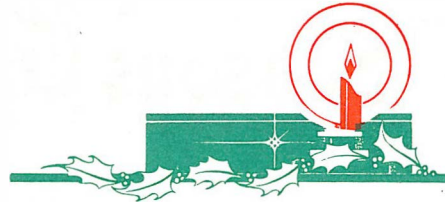

equipment, makes much more labor, and the PO loses because each carrier has to read the address - although it has no name on it- and then make up his mail just as if it were addressed to someone!'

I believe they would not have to keep raising postal rates if the department could be run like a small business. This operation alone is certainly worthy of official analysis, as any mailer will allow. and I'll bet postal employes would agree.

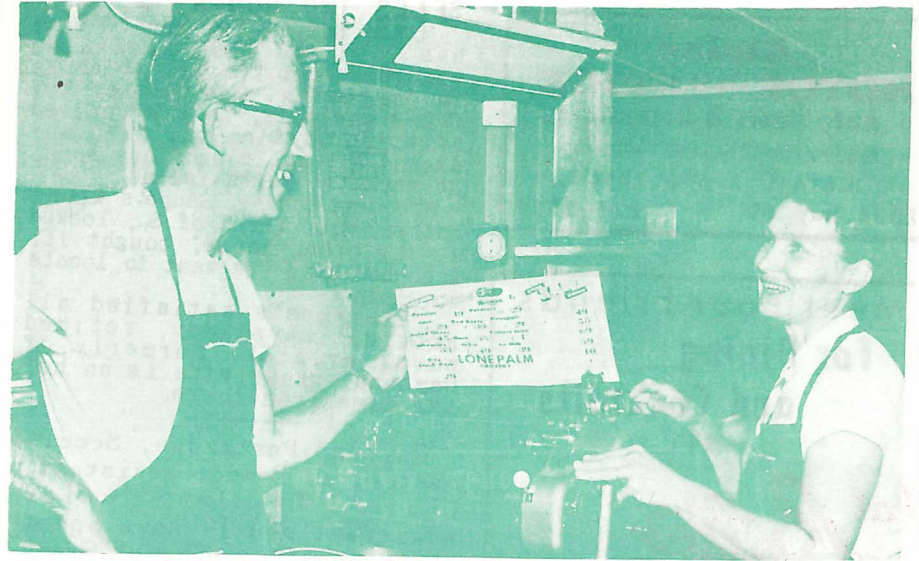

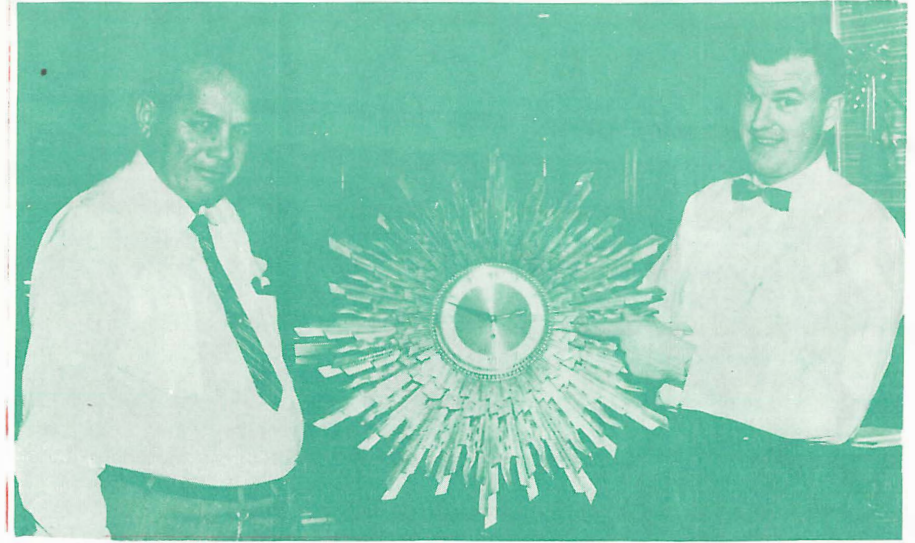
### SELLS TWO HOMES
