## Contracts Awarded

To buy furniture and equipment for the new Harbison Canyon plant, Alpine's school board Monday night awarded 12 firms contracts totalling \$13,228.79. Bidding was highly competitive, running \$2,264.71 less than allowable under state loan program. One local firm was named, Al Hinkle Lumber.

The El Captus Fund is \$7000 short of its goal. Band and athletic uniforms at \$4000 and choir robes at \$1500 made up the bulk of the money allotted, although small amounts were set aside for other departments.

### LEGAL NOTICE

Resolution of Intention to Dedicate to the San Diego Gas & Electric Company an Easement for an Electric Pole Line Over, Along and Across Property Owned by the Alpine Union School District.

On motion of Member Mr. Rushing, seconded by Member Mr. Wilcox, the following resolution is adopted:

WHEREAS, the San Diego Gas & Electric Company is desirous of securing an easement for an electric pole line over, along and across certain real property owned by the Alpine Union School District of San Diego County, California, and hereinafter described: and

WHEREAS, said Gas & Electric Company has requested this Board to dedicate said easement to said Gas & Electric Company; and

WHEREAS, in the judgment of this Board public convenience makes it expedient that said request be granted:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Governing Board of the Alpine Union School District of San Diego County, California, hereby resolves that it is the intention of this Board to dedicate to the San Diego Gas & Electric Company an easement for an electric pole line over, along and across the following described real property in the County of San Diego, State of California, and more particularly described as follows:

Those certain portions of the Southeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  and of the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Southeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 30, Township 15 South, Range 2 East, San Bernardino Meridian, described in a Deed recorded in Book 7876, page 553 Official Records of said County of San Diego.

The said easement in the aforesaid lands is particularly described as follows:

corner of said Southeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 30; thence South  $89^{\circ}40'$  West, along the Southerly line thereof, 410.40 feet to a point on the center line of Road Survey No. 728, filed in the office of the Surveyor of said County of San Diego; thence North  $38^{\circ}57'$  East, along said center line, 175.58 to the beginning of a tangent curve concave Northwesterly having a radius of 500.0 feet; thence Northeasterly, along the arc of said curve, through a central angle of  $19^{\circ}02'$ , a distance of 166.10 feet; thence, tangent to said curve, North  $19^{\circ}55'$  East 788.19 feet; thence South  $89^{\circ}39'$  West 44.72 feet to the true point of beginning of said center line of right of way; thence from said true point of beginning, South  $19^{\circ}55'30''$  West 556.0 feet, more or less to the Southerly line of the above described property. Also: Beginning at said true point of beginning; thence South  $89^{\circ}39'$  West 340.0 feet.

Provided, however, that in the event the use of said real property for electric pole line purposes is discontinued, said property shall revert to the Alpine Union School District of San Diego County, California.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said dedication be made upon the following terms and conditions:

EXCEPTING AND RESERVING unto the Grantor the right to fence with gates so as not to restrict entry by the Grantee; and the right to cross or make use of the surface in a manner not detrimental to the installation, construction, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of an electric pole line, or to any other purposes and uses as are or may be necessary or incidental to the construction, maintenance and operation of said electric pole line by the Grantee.

### LOG CABIN GETS PARKING

Barney Ratliff, owner of the Log Cabin Cafe, whose business has been hampered by recent parallel parking ticketing by the CHP, is filling his lot to the east, making an entrance to another lot on the west where Lewinson's Mining Service operates with Alpine Land Co. He had planned moving the small structure but the code stopped that. Sadly, the old oak giant, brother to the one growing within the cafe, had to be sacrificed. It was believed to be around 150 years old But such is progress.

THAT THE GRANTOR HEREBY agrees for itself, its successors and assigns that, save and except by written permission of the Grantee herein, it will not construct or cause to be constructed and maintained any buildings or structures of any nature or kind other than above mentioned, nor to plant any trees, nor to drill any wells within the limits of said right of way; and will not interfere with the right of ingress or egress along the electric pole line and across the adjacent lands of the Grantor by the Grantee or its representatives for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing, operating and maintaining said electric pole line or for any Grantee uses; and that it will not make or cause or permit to be made, any change in surface grade of the right of way hereby granted.

THAT THE GRANTEE hereby agrees not to fence the property, nor to prevent Grantor's crossing over the right of way, and agrees that the Grantor may enjoy the continued surface use of the land herein described, subject to the conditions above stated; and agrees to permit the installation by the Grantor of water pipe, or drainage pipe and sewer pipe, over and across the right of way in a manner which will not interfere with the Grantee's electric pole line; and the Grantee agrees after the installation of the electric pole line, to restore the surface to as near the original condition as practicable.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a public meeting be held by the Board at its regular place of meeting, Elementary School, Highway 80, Alpine, California, on January 25, 1960, at 8:00 o'clock p.m., at which time all persons interested may appear and show cause if any

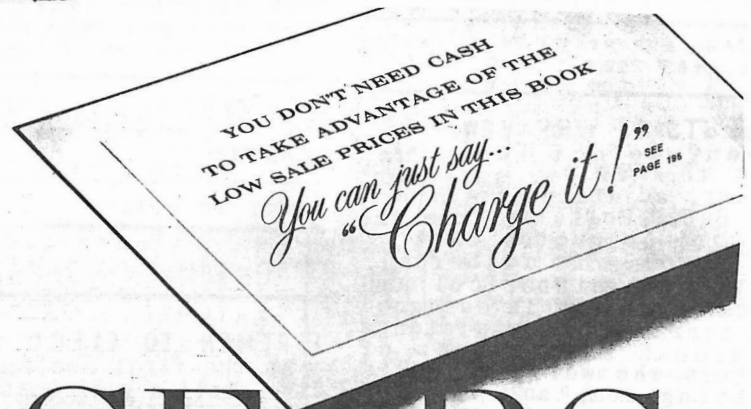
