Statler Ranch Sold

Gren Pierce of Pierce Realty in EC has just gone to escrow as buyer of the 100-acre Statler Ranch, South Grade Road, which Statler took over from the Hartman estate. It was formerly owned by the DE Motts. Pierce told the Sun Wednesday he had no plans as yet. This is the fourth large property he has bought recently in Alpine. The place has a large home, stables, pool and dressing rooms, olive grove and other outbuildings with 70 acres of raw land. No price was disclosed.

But I remember once when I caught a slip in print, I asked him how it ever got past his machine. He merely said 'I dunno', with a twinkle in his eye. I guess sometimes they let their humor get the best of efficiency-- with a laugh for all.

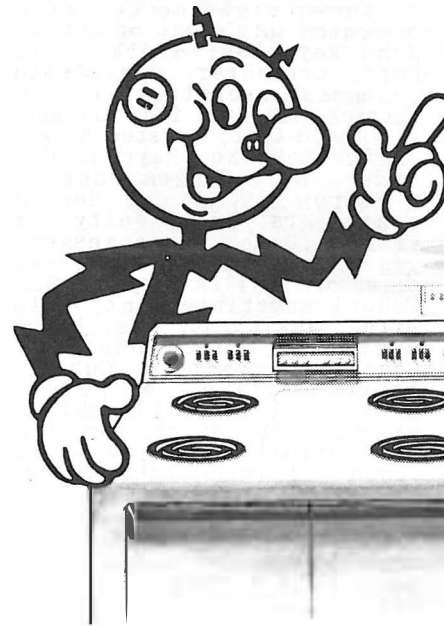
Recently in the SD Union was one that struck me as being correct although it was an error! The story told of Caryl Chessman's new petition on his stay of execution: 'It was the 13th time the highest court has turned Chessman down during the 116 years he has been in San Quentin Prison's condemned row'.

Factually he has lived 11½ years in death row, been condemned seven times to die a horrible death in civilization's grisly gas chamber for a crime many are not sure he committed, and which he stoutly denies. He has been refused a lie-detector test. California prosecutors are in a dither to get him under ground.

But he has a good point of law-- the transcript of his trial is clouded as the court reporter died before he could make a transcription, according to law. An alcoholic nepotist stenographer was paid a high sum to do it, proved to have over 2000 errors. (See story in Union's

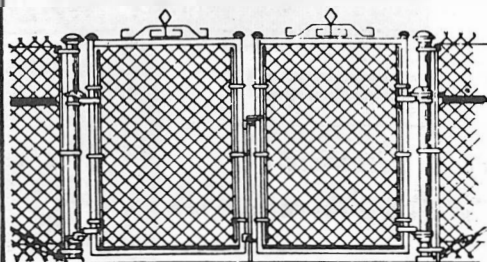

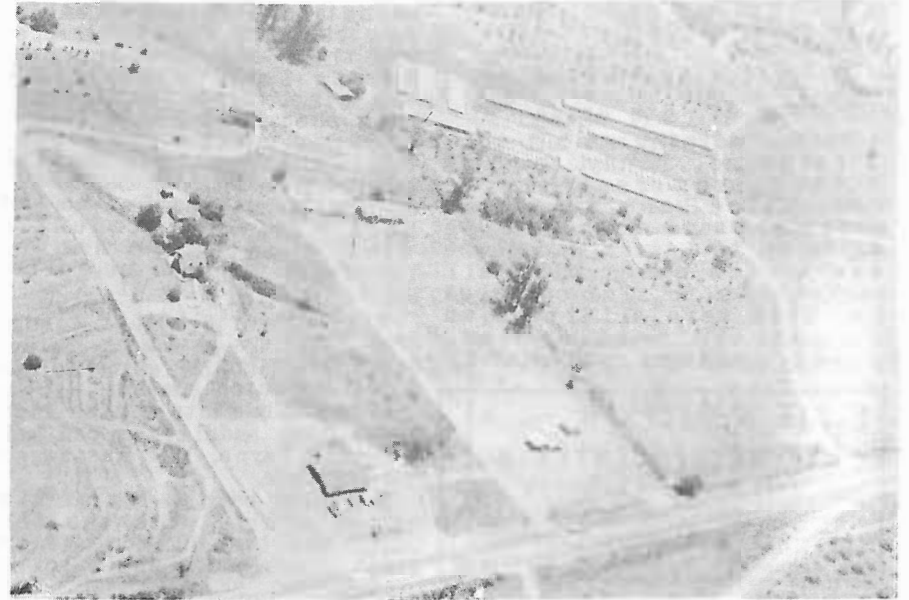

TRI-HI-Y HAS ELECTION

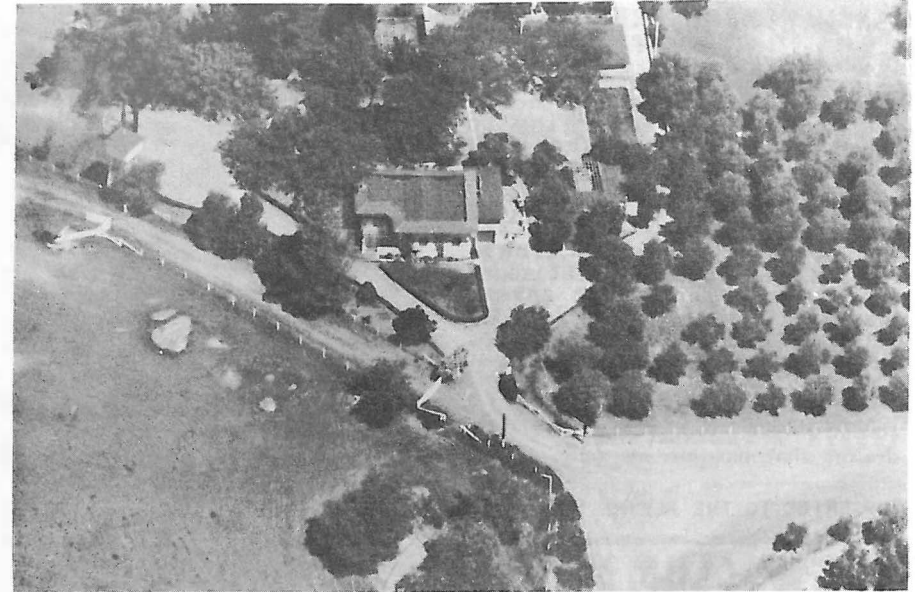

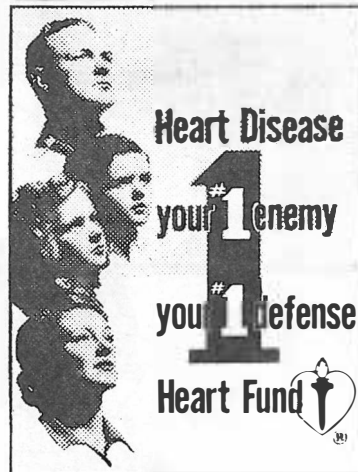

If approved, they will then be given entitlement to Colorado water. Then will come engineering surveys, costs and so on to bring the water to each area.

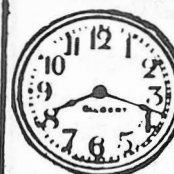
